

RUSSIANS SENDING FRESH TROOPS TO BORDER LINE AREA

Japanese Officers Expect Still More Vigorous Measures in Conflict Over Disputed Boundary Hills.

Yuki, Korean (Near the Siberian Frontier), Aug. 8.—(AP)—Japanese officers reported today fresh Russian reinforcements were being brought into the border battle zone after heavy shelling of the Shachofeng sector, northeast of Changchung.

They said they expected the Russians soon to take "still more vigorous measures" in the conflict over the border hills which Russian soldiers began fortifying July 11 and which Japanese forces captured July 31.

Severe shelling of the Shachofeng sector began at dawn today and continues through the day.

Prepared To Repulse Attack
The officers said the Japanese army had made the fullest preparations to repulse any new attack on the positions.

Soviet warplane activity was reported today because of low clouds. In yesterday's Soviet shelling of the Rashin railway, the station at Rogui, ten miles from here, was blown up.

A section hand was killed and a number of others wounded when a shell hit a first aid station.

Japanese said there were no Japanese casualties in the bombardment during recent days but that there were numerous casualties among Korean villagers.

BOTH ARMIES SEEKING REST IN EBRO AREA
