

GERMAN MANEUVERS ALARM EUROPEANS; FRENCH BAN VISITS

British War Office Warns Military Need Special Certificates; Relations With Italy Become Strained.

London, Aug. 13.—(AP)—White House staked through Europe today, the British war office warned all Britons holding military rank that they must get special certificates in order to avoid "trouble" if and when they travel to Germany.

Almost simultaneously France clamped down regulations virtually forbidding French citizens to go to Italy, whose relations with France suddenly have become colder since German Chancellor Adolf Hitler's Italian visit last May.

Require Special Visas The French Foreign office announced special visas and special reasons must be had before Frenchmen can visit Italy. This was in retaliation for an unexplained Italian refusal or reluctance to give Italian papers needed for traveling in France.

Diplomats in European capitals strove, meanwhile, to make a coherent picture of the international situation from developments and disclosures in the past 36 hours, such as the following:

Eastern Maneuvers German based preparations for giant maneuvers next month of the regular army, already capable of overnight action, reserve units which have not participated in such maneuvers with the army since the World War, and possibly, World War veterans between 30 and 45 years.

The Nazi government decreed the requisitioning of grain storage rooms for the bumper German crop; announced anyone disseminating industrial secrets to foreigners would be imprisoned under a law of July 28; banned trucks and buses and Nazi buildings have been requisitioned.

Border Residents Worried Residents of the area on both sides the German-Czechoslovak frontier were worried about German preparations for the giant maneuvers. Some said 1,000,000 men would participate in the maneuvers. In London the continuing demand for gold mirrored European uneasiness.

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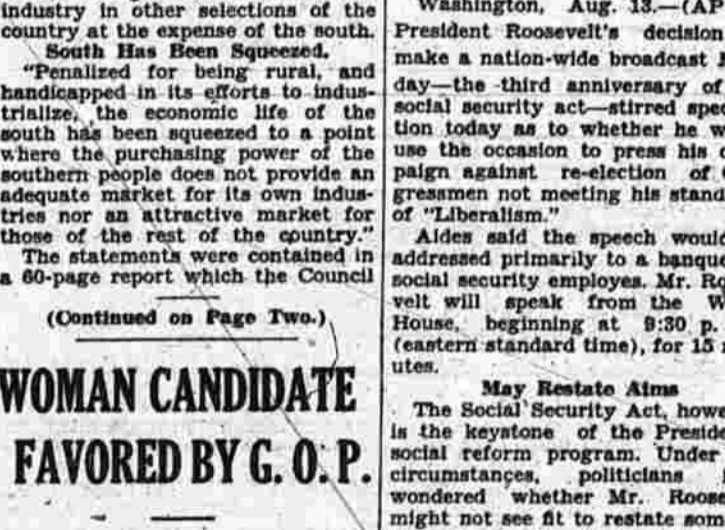
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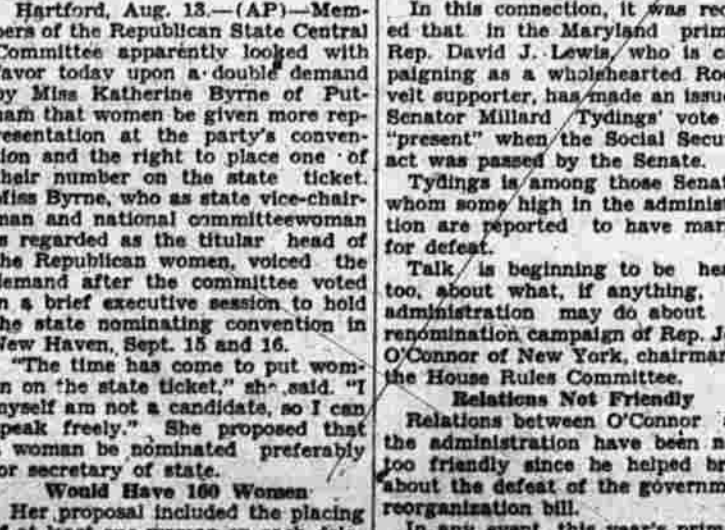

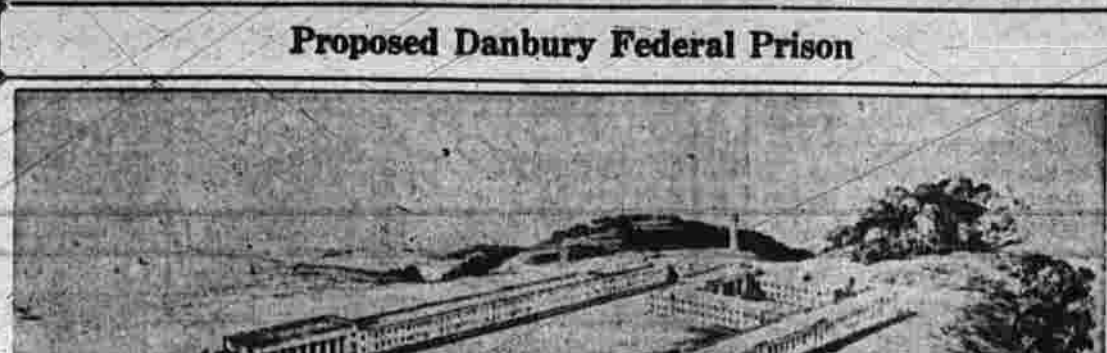
