DEWEY SAYS SCHULTZ MOB BOOSTED HINES AS POLITICAL BUFFER

Prosecutor Charges Tammany District Leader Present At Meeting When Gang Leader Laid Plan To 'Take Over' Unorganized Policy Racket; Dixie Davis Also Present At Session Of Racketeers

New York, Aug. 17.—(AP)—District Attorney Thomas E. Dewey today told a "blue ribbon" jury that the notorious Dutch Schultz mob advertised to the underworld that James J. Flinn, powerful Tammany district leader, was political protector of the multi-million dollar policy racket.

Dewey charged that Hines was present with Abraham "Bo" Weinberg, a Schultz mobster, in March, 1932, at a meeting in which the Schultz gang laid plans to "take over" the policy racket, then unorganized.

Davis Present At Meeting The prosecutor said J. Richard (Dick) Davis, known as "the kid mouthpiece" of the Schultz gang, who has pleaded guilty and turned state's evidence in the present trial, was also present at the meeting.

Causes Thrown Out of Court In his opening statement at the trial, Dewey said that the Schultz racket contributed to the campaign funds of former District Attorney William Copeland Dodge, whom Dewey has named in a bill of particulars as having been "bribee."

EXPENSE REPORTS DIVIDE PROBE

Campaign Expenditures Committee Compromises On Breakdown Of Accounts.

Washington, Aug. 17.—(AP)—Members of the Senate Campaign Expenditures Committee divided today over the question of making Senatorial candidates account for expenses and contributions of their running-mates for lesser offices.

Chairman Sheppard (D-Tex.) said the committee debated using that method to force candidates for the Senate to furnish more complete accounts of individual expenditures and receipts, but compromised temporarily. It added this statement to a new questionnaire for all Senatorial candidates:

"If receipts and expenditures in your behalf have been grouped with those of other candidates, please give a breakdown of the part of the amount received in behalf of your nomination or election to the Senate. Likewise, give a breakdown of the part of the amount which was spent in your behalf."

RENDERS COURT'S FINANCIAL REPORT

Dannaher's Figures Show Slightly Lower Monthly Income Than Previously.

The financial report of the Manchester Town Court, submitted to Town Treasurer George H. Waddell by Deputy Judge and Clerk of the Court Thomas Dannaher, and covering the past thirteen and a half months during the tenure of office of Judge Harold W. Gurry, shows that during the period there were disposed of a total of 544 cases.

Last year, under the tenure of office of the previous Court, the total number of cases was 527, and the total fine income was \$13,294.23.

Of this, \$5,012.17 went to the town, and \$7,486.06 went to the state. These figures cover a twelve month period from July 1, 1936 to July 1, 1937. The present Court has been in office for thirteen and a half months to date, the report being rendered at this time as a move to effect a consolidation of the Court's fiscal year and the town's fiscal year.

A comparison of the record of the previous Court with the financial statement of the present Court, on a monthly average basis, shows that the present Court is operating to bring an income some \$10 a month, or \$480 per year, less into the town treasury than did the Court before it.

It is pointed out, however, that the Court is not expected to pay all of its own expenses, as the appropriation for this year was \$8,000. Deducing the income to the town from this appropriation leaves, therefore, a net expense of \$2,000 approximately, to the town for support of the Court.

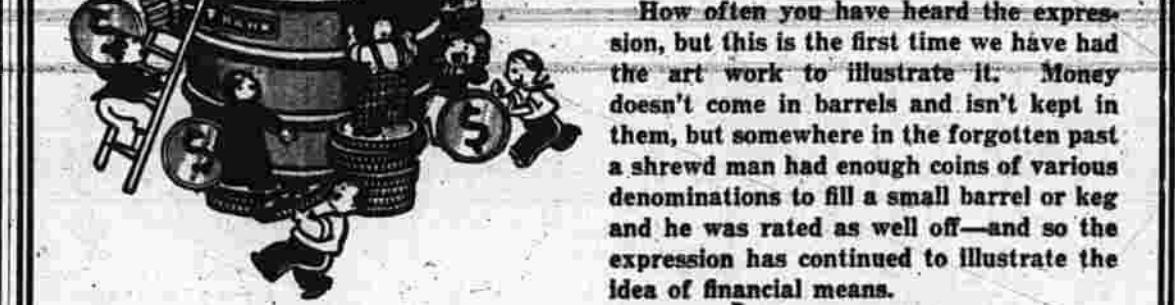
