

## 20 KILLED, 74 HURT IN BOMB EXPLOSION IN CROWDED MART

Detonation So Terrific It  
Could Be Heard Clearly  
For Ten Miles; Ugly Arab  
Mob Faces British Police.

**Jaffa, Palestine, Aug. 26.—(AP)—**A deafening bomb explosion in a crowded vegetable market today killed at least 20 Arabs and wounded 74 others, ten of them dangerously, as dawn was breaking in this Biblical city.

The explosion was so terrific that the detonation could be heard clearly within a radius of ten miles. Crowds flocked to the scene and faced an ugly Arab mob seeking revenge.

It attacked Barclay's bank, the Anglo-Palestine bank, set fire to many shops and stoned, waylaid and shot Jewish pedestrians who were hurrying to the all-Jewish city of Tel Aviv for refuge.

Ten Jews were taken to hospitals after attacks. An automobile belonging to the manager of Barclay's bank was turned over and set ablaze.

**Police Forced to Fire**  
The situation became so threatening the police were forced to fire on the angry crowds and finally restored a semblance of order with the aid of troops.

A strong detachment of soldiers from Jaffa from outlying points and armored cars took positions on the main streets. Machine gun posts were set up on the border line between Jaffa and Tel Aviv.

The most pathetic aspect of the bombing, similar to the market place explosion at Haifa last July 16, was that five young boys were killed and seven were gravely wounded.

Curfew imposed immediately after the explosion. Authorities imposed an indefinite curfew.

**When this correspondent attempted** to go to the scene from Jerusalem accepting the Stars and Stripes, he was halted by authorities.

**Grant Sudetens**  
NEW CONCESSIONS  
Action By Czechs Comes Almost Simultaneously With German Diplomatic Move.

**Prague, Aug. 26.—(AP)—**Disclosures of a German diplomatic démarche in several European capitals on the Sudeten German issue and new Prague government concessions to its autonomy-demanding German minority came almost simultaneously today.

**Information reaching the Czechoslovak government** indicated Germany had told other powers she might have to act to sponsor the Sudeten German demands if a solution were too long delayed, but that such action would not be in nature of an attack.

## TOUGH GUARDS DEATHS CAUSE, CORONER SAYS

Believes Building Used Intentionally As "Roaster" For Disciplining Unruly Prisoners By Terrorists Mob.

**Philadelphia, Aug. 26.—(AP)—**A group of "tough" guards, whose duties Coroner Charles H. Hersch said included punishing unruly convicts, was blamed today for the Philadelphia county prison's death in the "Klondike"—a stuffy steam-heated isolation building.

**Intentionally Used As "Roaster"**  
He said deaths of four men Monday in the "Klondike" by 50 Philadelphia county guards at a long building heated by foot-long radiators, indicated that the building had been used intentionally as a "roaster" for disciplining prisoners.

**CLOSER TIES MADE DURING HORTHY VISIT**  
Premier Conferred With German Economics Minister, Forming Basis For Later Detailed Negotiations.

**Berlin, Aug. 26.—(AP)—**Groundwork for closer economic ties than ever before between Germany and Hungary, informed sources said today is being laid during the state visit of Hungary's regent, Admiral Nicholas Horthy.

**It was disclosed that Bela Imredi,** Hungarian economics minister, conferred with Horthy's aide, confederate here, Rudolf Brinkmann, secretary of state in the economic ministry.

**It was understood their conversations** would form the basis for detailed negotiations by specialists in both countries leading to a close economic agreement.

**That the Hungarian visitors** kept an eye on the meeting of the Little Entente powers at Bled, Yugoslavia, while accepting Horthy's hospitality appeared from interviews by Imredi and Hungarian Foreign Minister Coleman von Ranya, published in the German newspaper, the Bremer National Zeitung.

**"Our rearmament and renunciation** of the use of force, on the one hand, and the protection of minorities on the other, are clearly dependent one on the other," the newspaper quoted von Ranya as saying.

**"The Bled agreement** can, therefore, become effective only when an accord is reached regarding a declaration about minorities to be given by Czechoslovakia."

**"Furthermore, Hungary's attitude** in the future will depend upon how promises made in this minority declaration are kept."

**The Little Entente powers—**Czechoslovakia, Rumania and Yugoslavia—agreed at Bled to disregard the arms limitation pact with Hungary by the Tripartite powers and announced that separate non-aggression and minority agreements between Hungary and the other two states would be concluded shortly.

**Walt Czech Division** At Prague on these already in perfect with Rumania and Yugoslavia but has not become effective yet because both countries want to await Czechoslovakia's decision.

**The extent of the government** concessions was not revealed, but it was known they formed the subject of a conference between Vice-count Rumstein, unofficial British mediator in this conflict, and a committee of the Sudeten German party.

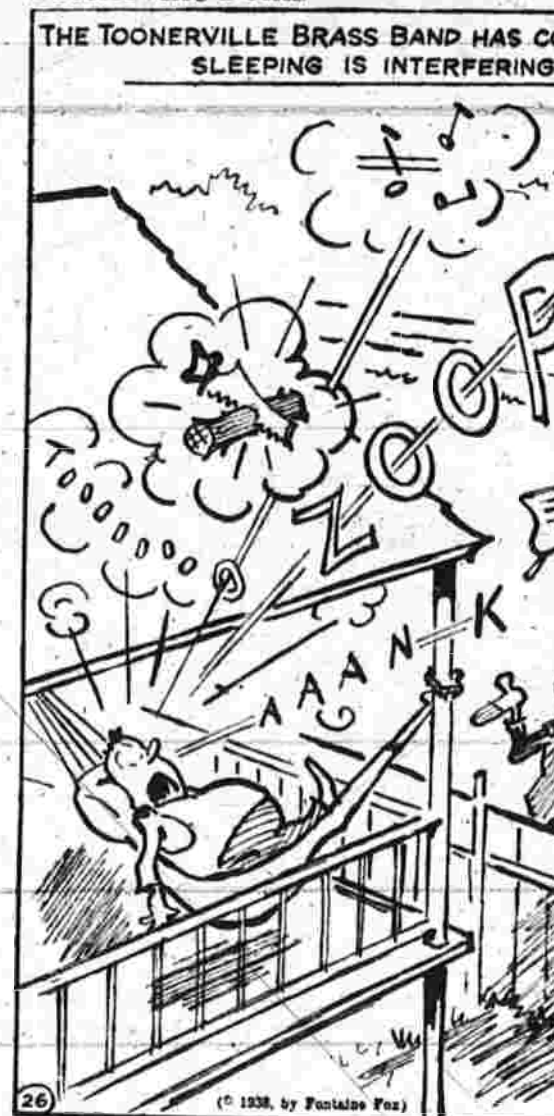

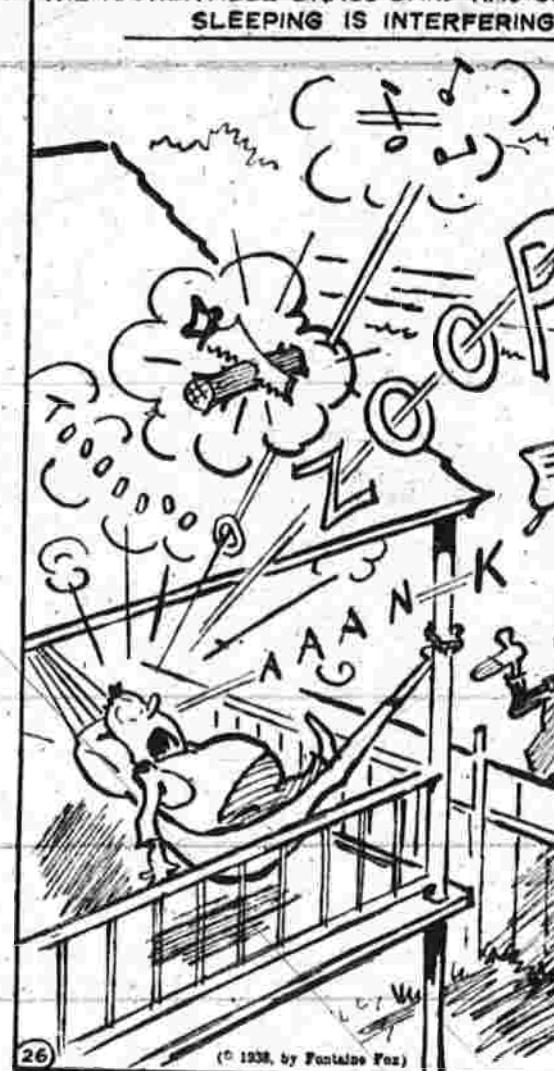

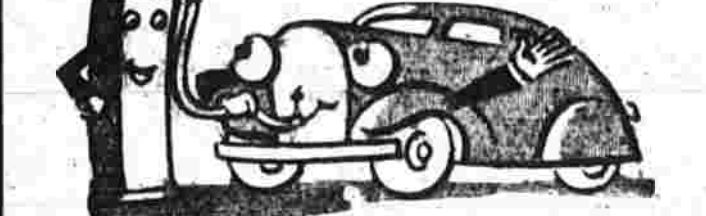
