

CORONER CHARGES CONSPIRACY HALTS PLANS FOR ARREST

Says Guards Agreed To Cover Up What Really Happened When 4 Convicts Met Mysterious Deaths.

Philadelphia, Aug. 27.—(AP)—Coroner Charles H. Herch charged today there was a "definite conspiracy on the part of guards to cover up what really happened" at the Philadelphia county prison where four convicts met mysterious deaths in super-heated punishment cells.

The coroner said the "conspiracy" had temporarily delayed his plans to arrest "higher ups" and a "black-fist squad" of guards who he blamed for turning steam on in a battery of large radiators outside the cells and "literally baking the prisoners to death."

The coroner's charges were made Monday in a late afternoon hearing at the coroner's office. Herch said the four convicts were found Monday in the prison "Kendall"—a semi-dark, stuffy 16 by 20-foot building in which Herch said 25 unruly prisoners were given the "heat cure" for participating in a hunger strike. Besides those who died, five others are in hospital, ill from shock and fever.

Herch said the guards obviously rehearsed their story in an attempt to whitewash the whole affair, the coroner declared. Assistant District Attorney John A. Boyle, who with Herch is conducting the investigation, asserted that the four dead men had been "tortured for three days" by the "blackjack squad" in the nearby arched cells where investigators estimated the temperature was as high as 150 degrees.

Boyle questioned the guards at the prison until late last night and then summoned eight who were on duty the night the convicts died for further interrogation. Two guards, Francis Smith, 43, and Alfred W. Brough, 39, already are held in \$2,500 bail each as material witnesses.

G. O. P. HAS BIG INDIANA RALLY, STARTING DRIVE

Washington, Ind., Aug. 27.—(AP)—The Republican party opened in a midwestern cornfield today a drive to gain control of Congress this year and pave the way for election of a President in 1940. Officials urged their followers to put their strength into electing new Republican Congressmen in November so as to improve the party's chances of defeating the Democrats in the Presidential election two years away.

SIMON WARNS NAZIS TO KEEP THEIR HANDS OFF CZECH PROBLEM

Speech At Lanark Serves Notice Britain Might Have To Fight If Hitler Started War In Central Europe; Hitler Is Not Named; Unofficial Status Of Runciman Is Stressed; Simon Urges A Settlement By Czechs And Sudetens.

Lanark, Scotland, Aug. 27.—(AP)—Sir John Simon, chancellor of the exchequer, served notice on an anxious world today that Great Britain might have to fight if Germany started a war in central Europe. The former foreign minister repeated, "as holding good today," Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain's declaration before the House of Commons March 24 that "if we were to be confined to those who have assumed such obligations to aid Czechoslovakia against aggression."

Simon coupled a firm warning that there "is no limit to the reaction of war" today with a "unanimous" plea for a settlement by Czechs and Sudetens. He said that Germany had already warned other capitals that such crossroads might be near as Sir John's speech added point.

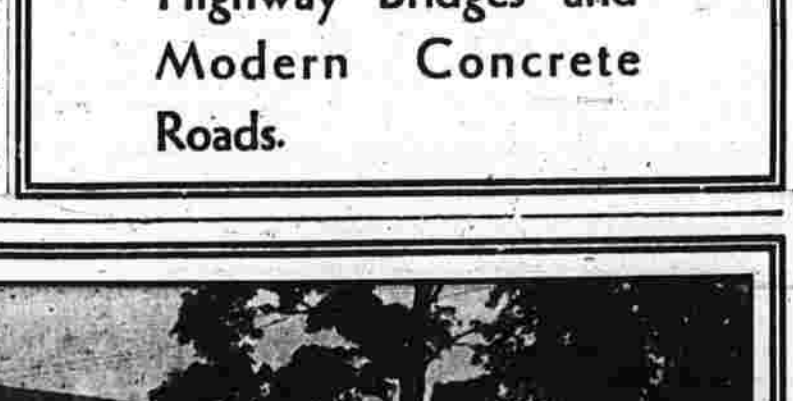

MANCHESTER'S ELECTRIC FIRM SPENT \$35,000 ON IMPROVEMENT

Street Lighting Plan For East Center Street Took Work Of Months; Details Of How Project Was Done

The general street lighting plan and adjacent customer service on East Center street underwent a complete revision preparatory to the construction of the new boulevard highway from the Center to the junction of Middle Turnpike. The work was completed by the Geo. W. Ellis Co. Inc., Boston. Work was begun about March 7 and was completed about July 1 and the new installation cost approximately \$35,000.

The new "feeder" line from New Street to the East Center street lighting load and the customer service along the highway. The new "feeder" line from New Street was tapped at Hamlin street by a cable carrying 2500 volt treatment from Goodwin street east as far as Main street and easterly as far as Goodwin street, emerging for street lighting and customer service on side streets leading off East Center street.

The installation of the new-type cable construction replaced the old open-wire construction which formerly was located at the Center.

The company installed a series of modern General Electric lights on an alternate or "staggered" plan along the sidewalks on both the north and south sides of East Center street from the Center to Foster street. These lights, 37 in number, are known as model 78-R units and are of 600 candlepower and 20 ampere. Formerly there were but 17 lights along the street, carried directly in the center of this wide thoroughfare. New poles were set for the new lighting equipment, the lights being brightened from 17 1/2 feet to 22 1/2 feet above the sidewalk.

Transformers Installed New transformers were installed at four points along the street, one opposite the Masonic Temple in a vault to care for the customer service from Main street to Summit street; one at Spruce street to supply service along the street from Madison street to Hill street; one at Benton street for customer service from the Cheney Homestead to a short distance beyond Benton street, north side and another at Walter street to provide service from Benton street to Main street.

Open Wire Equipment From Goodwin street east to the junction of East Center street and

located on the sidewalk side of each of the poles and house services are connected to them. Superintendent McCaw made a wooden model of the service box and the units were made in quantity for initial installation by the Lee-Material Company of Stroudsburg, Pa. The cost of the new construction and equipment installed in connection with the East Center street modernizing construction was \$35,000, company officials stated.

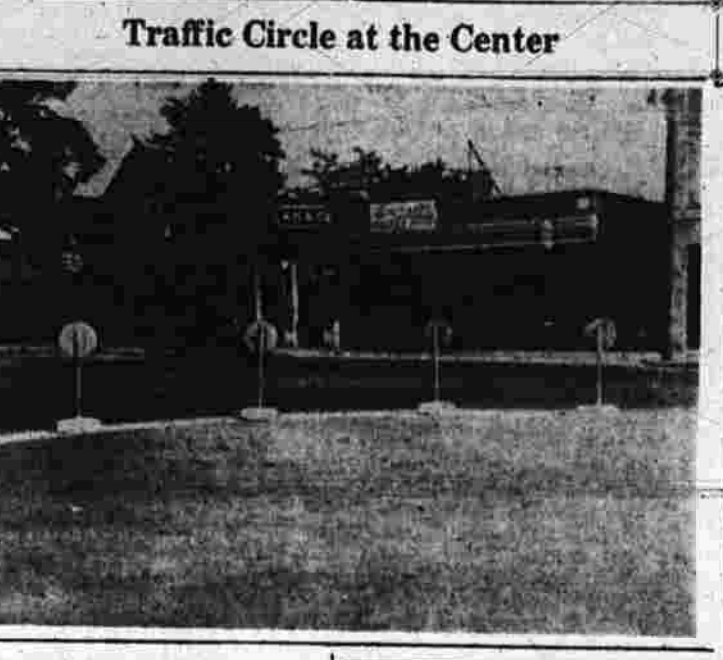

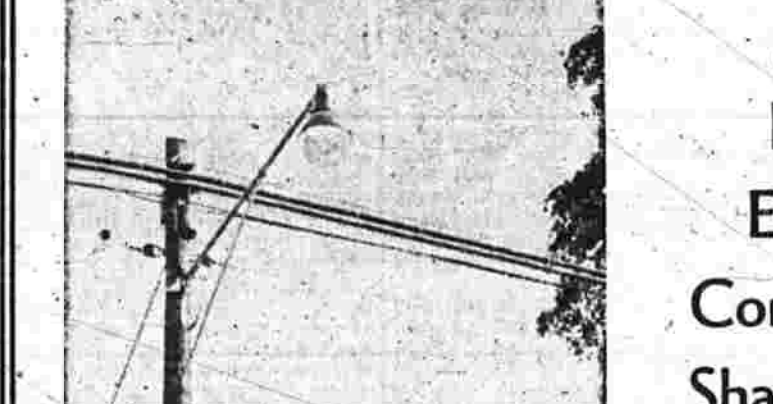

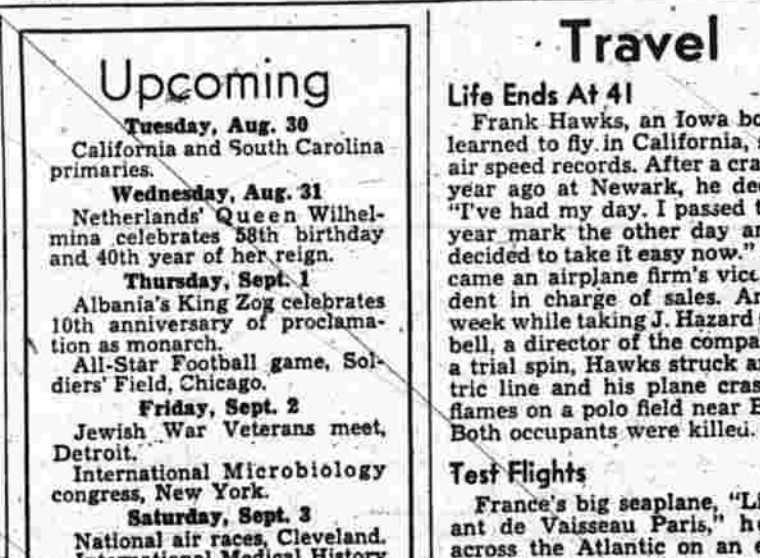
