The typhoon roared northwestward over the Japan sea toward the mainland of Asia. Meteorologists said it might change its course, however.

Police estimated 15,000 persons were homeless in Tokyo alone as the terrific winds flattened many homes.

Liner's Moorings Snap

The largest of the steamers to go aground in Yokohama harbor was the 15,346-ton Chitral of the Peningular and Oriental line. Its moorings snapped, and the ship swerved to cut the lines of two other craft. All three were driven to shore.
