

Children's Bureau Head Rules

No. Any producer, manufacturer or dealer who ships or delivers for shipment any goods produced in violation of the law may be prose-Is it necessary for conviction, to prove that the actual goods shipped or delivered were products of child labor?

No, if such illegal, child labor was employed anywhere in or about the establishment from which the goods came within 30 days prior to removal of the goods, it is unlawful to put the goods in the channels of
