U. S. WOMEN STAGE AN AMAZING COMEBACK TO RETAIN THE CURTIS CUP

Capture Five of Six Single Matches From British Rivals in Biennial Event to Gain Links Trophy For Third Time.

Manchester, Mass., Sept. 9.—(AP)—By capturing five of six single matches for a 3-2 to 2-3 victory over brilliant British rivals, the American women's Curtis Cup team today retained that international trophy.

The surprising rally of the domestic golfers shattered the commanding lead the invaders had won in the match and gave the American team a commanding lead in the biennial event. The British women have never come in carrying off the cup two years ago when in the third of the biennial matches they won the trophy.

Headed by Mrs. Andrew M. Holm, British champion, and Miss Betty Little, a commanding lead Wednesday afternoon. They kept their lead until the final hole of the match.

When Charlie Therman of Ireland, gained a 2-1 victory over Mrs. Therman, the American team was left with a chance to gain an advantage. They kept their opportunity alive until the last two strokes reached the last tee all even. Then Mrs. Therman, in a brilliant comeback, put her fourth shot in a hook which brought the British to 18 feet beyond the pin to win.
