Talmadge, Also Critic Of Administration Running Secretary, Concedes Defeat.

Atlanta, Sept. 15.—(AP)—Unofficial returns from yesterday's Democratic primary early this afternoon showed Senator Walter F. George re-elected in the face of presidential opposition.

At 1 p. m. (e.s.t.) tabulation showed the Senate veteran leading in the complete count from 71 of the state's 139 counties with 508 of the 416 unit votes in his column.

Gov. E. D. RIVERS, seeking re-election to complete his "little New Deal" program, also passed the required unit majority, while the complete returns from 20 counties gave him 218 unit votes.

Former Governor Eugene Talmadge, New Deal critic and second runner-up, was ahead in 72 counties with 110 unit votes.

There are a total of 416 unit votes in Georgia, 298 being necessary to establish a winner in this race.
