Big Bus in Plunge Into River Here

BUS, 15 ON BOARD. DROPS INTO RIVER OFF TRESTLE HERE

All Escape Serious Injury | BITES TAIL OFF CAT: The Love Lane Junction.

The driver and fourteen passen-gers of a Blueways Trailways interstate bus, bound from Boston to New York, escaped possible drown-ing and severe injuries at 10.50 last night when the bus plunged into the Hocksnum river on the south side of the Hockanum river bridge AS WAR LOOMS the trolley trestle just west of Love Lane junction on Middle Turnpike

The cause of the accident has not yet been determined. The bus veered to the left a short distance east of the bridge, crossed the trolley tracks and plunged into the Hockamum river, a drop of about 10 feet into the middle of the river.

Although suffering from a head and shoulder injury and possible internal injuries, Albert Edgecomb, 29, of 158 Orchard street, Watertown, Mass., opened the front door of the bus, which was close to a projecting beam of the trestle, and one by one he assisted the passengers from the interior of the bus to the trestle and safety.

Ambulances Arrive

Acall was sent in to the East Hartford police station and Hartford and two ambulances were sent from the latter and Holloran's and Dougan's ambulances responded. The ambulance of W. P. Quish was called but was then on the way to bring Frank White of Hebron, critically injured by a hit and run driver, to the hospital.

Those of the passengers who were able to assist themselves were placed in passing automobiles and taken to the Memorial hospital. Others went to the hospital in Holloran's ambulance. Three others, whose names were not learned, were taken from the scene of the accident in private cars to continue their trip from Hartford.
