

EMERGENCY MEET TO MAP PROGRAM FOR STATE RELIEF

Cross Summons Municipal Officials; Waters Yield New Bodies; Death List Now 74—Victims Aided.

Hartford, Sept. 27.—(AP)—Gov. Wilbur L. Cross summoned municipal officials to an emergency conference at the state capitol today to map a program of relief, and restoration in Connecticut's flood and hurricane ravaged areas.

The conference met at the state capitol building and was presided over by the governor. The state is gradually recovering from the staggering blow dealt by wind and water, and the work of clearing away wreckage to survey anew the toll of life, human suffering and property destruction taken by the twin catastrophes.

Waters inland and along the debris-laden coast of Long Island Sound yielded new bodies which added to the list of known dead to 74; between 12,000 and 15,000 disaster victims were being succored by the Red Cross, and official estimates bolstered unofficial tabulations setting property loss well above \$50,000,000.

Government Assistance Fledgling The government plan to confer with Federal WPA Administrator Harry Hopkins and the governors of the New England states at which government assistance was pledged is meeting the emergency.

Vincent J. Sullivan, state WPA administrator who accompanied the governor to the Boston conference, asserted he was authorized by Hopkins to launch rehabilitation projects at once. He said the amount of federal funds to be allocated to Connecticut will be determined probably within a week.
