Total of 1,476 Ballots Cast At That Hour—One Machine Not Even Been Used; Expect Rush Later.

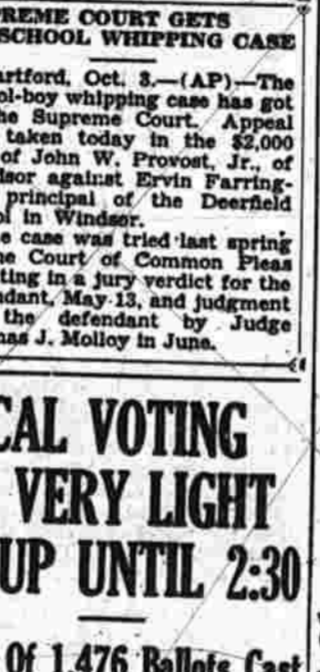

NOT FOR LONG... During the World War, particularly in its earlier stages, English girls in great numbers performed a demure duty which was the very reverse of that which is now being performed by young men who were not in uniform, thus sparing them an awkward or painful, and the two words meant the same thing to all concerned.

What constitutes the value of human life? What makes the mere function of continuing to breathe worth anything? Life in New England in 1770 was perhaps as fine as human existence has ever been, anywhere, at any time. The people were dignified, they looked and their labor was rewarded. They lived, not in squalor and pain, but in homes, spacious and beautiful; they owned their homes and their lands; there was no unemployment; there was no such thing as unescapable poverty. They were a settled people in a decent splendor of respectability and life.

But they did not hesitate for an instant to put this kind of life aside and with their old fowling pieces and their ancient muskets, their hand-to-hand and ball and buckshot, they fought the battle of the British empire, the death of the British empire, the wounds, the fevers and starvation of the campaign; they did not believe that any sacrifice of their way of living was preferable to death.

In a thousand spots upon the face of the earth, men and women and children, throughout all time, have dared physical destruction rather than surrender anything that made it worth while for the heart to keep on beating. If now the time has come when that urge to defend a worthwhile life shall unflinchingly surrender to the mere animal-like instinct to keep on existing, then the sooner all mankind surrenders the earth back to the braver and more worthy arts, bees and humming birds, the better.

It has not come. There are still the Chinese, there are still the people in Spain; there are still in the jungles and broken mountains of Abyssinia some strange, scrappy humans who hold firm to the belief that it is better to be dead than to be enslaved. And the irony of it is that to Britain, and in France, in America and in all the countries from which arises this chorus of wretchedness, there is no sacrifice that is so readily made as that of the lives of the people's names.
