## FANS STORM PARK FOR DEAN, GOMEZ CLASH IN SERIES

### Yankee Ace Seeks New Record Of Six Straight Wins Before Crowd Of 40,000; Weather Cold, Blustery.

**BULLETIN:** The New York Yankees gained a 2-1 lead over the Chicago Cubs as the final out of the third inning of the second game of the series today. The Cubs led the first on singles by Hack and Demaree but the Yankees came back in the second to score twice as D'Amico singled, Gehrig walked and Gordon's easy roller was turned into a two-bagger when Jurgens and Hack collided in trying to field the ball, which rolled into left field as D'Amico's and Gehrig scored.

Like yesterday, when the wind whistled and the Yankees opened with a brilliant offensive and defensive display to beat the Cubs, it was a blustery, chilly day. The Cubs made their first appearance of the season.

Gomez was heavily favored. The Cubs, who were favored to win, were out to become the first player in the big league's history to win six straight series games without a defeat. The Yankees, except for Gomez in the box, stood pat on their lineup which found Fred Demaree at the hot rightfield spot, Joe Marty in center and hitting cleanup and Carl Reynolds shifting from center to left.

## RECORD SHOWS STATE BETTER OFF UNDER GOP

### McConaughy Says Financial Status Under Republican Leadership Put Connecticut in Nation's Forefront.

On the other hand, the Democrats, also active, urged a state financial policy with the motto, "spurge to the voters and let our grandsons pay."
