Wire Service Affected

He said there had been several "very great magnetic storms which caused widespread interference with telephone and telegraph communication" and an "exceptionally bright aurora" was observed from Mount Wilson iast January.

During the present cycle for the first time astronomers established that short wave radio fade-outs immediately followed unusually bright eruptions near sun spots. R. S. Richardson, Mount Wilson astronomer, said the energy causing the fade-outs came from the sun with the speed of light and reached the earth in about eight minutes. 




