

### PROGRAM FOR ALL NEEDY SHOULD BE GIVEN PREFERENCE

#### Social Security Administration Official Raps California Plan of \$30 Paid On Every Thursday.

New Haven, Oct. 7.—(AP)—Miss Jany Hoy, an official of the Social Security Administration, said today that any program to aid all needy persons as a whole should take precedence over the interests of any one group.

In this connection, in her talk before the Connecticut conference of social workers, Miss Hoy attacked the so-called "30 every Thursday" pension plan advocated in California as typical of "wildcat schemes" and declared similar proposals would be introduced before the legislature of six states during the coming year.

Miss Hoy, who is director of the Bureau of Public Assistance of the Social Security Board, said in her talk on "Objectives of the Social Security Program in Relation to Public Welfare" that it was important to establish close inter-relationships of federal, state and community agencies in a three-fold partnership to promote a common aim.

Her main objective was the passage of merit system legislation in state and community administrative agencies throughout the country, and laws forbidding the employment of persons who are not qualified in their work to take part in political activity.

Miss Hoy's appearance on the program followed that of Dr. H. Jackson Davis, chief medical officer of the New York State Department of Welfare, who forecast yesterday that 10,000,000 persons probably would be provided with medical care by the federal government by 1942.

Douglas P. Falconer, executive director of the Greater New York Fund was on the program for luncheon address preceding social gatherings during the afternoon.

Davis, devoted much of his address to the following points:

#### Hour Required For Renaming Of Candidate

Congressman Without Opposition; Danaher Attacks Loss Of National Market Under Democratic Rule.

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#### Help In Research Termed Logical

More Extensive Participation In Scientific Studies Desirable Federal Action.

Chicago, Oct. 7.—(AP)—More extensive participation by the Federal government in scientific research was termed "logical and desirable" today by Thomas Farran, surgeon general of the U. S. Public Health Service.

The public is "entirely willing to support further studies to solve those problems of health and disease which will benefit us," Dr. Farran said in an address prepared for delivery at the dedication of a new research building of Abbot Laboratories in North Chicago.

He cleared the fountain-heads of scientific research "from being dry" and "the Federal government assume a larger responsibility for leadership in scientific research."

Speaking before a luncheon at the University of Chicago, Dr. Farran said that the main source of support for research was discontinued "if present economic and political trends continue."

Dr. Farran said it was likely that government support of research in universities would grow to larger proportions. However, the assumption of the Federal government would be to direct the funds "toward objectives appealing to the imagination of the people rather than toward the most fundamental advancement of knowledge."

Advocate Dismissed Criticism

Dr. Farran asked dispassionate and objective criticism of the government's role in research.

"Someone has defined a dictatorship as a condition in which every-thing not forbidden is contrary to the surgeon general said, "it that be true to scientist having freedom of knowledge of the cooperation between government and the agencies of voluntary research will have the highest priority in this country."

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### Slovak Delegation Told By Premier He Is Striving For Complete Equality In Government; Prompt Appointment Of Ministers Urged; Social Democrats Say His Party Approves

Prague, Oct. 7.—(AP)—Premier Gen. Jan Syrový today received a Slovak delegation headed by Dr. Joseph Tiso, prime minister of Slovakia, and promised that the government would speed legal changes necessary to make the Slovaks an autonomous unit in the Czechoslovak federal state.

The premier told Dr. Tiso and the representatives of his Slovak party that he was striving for complete equality in the government among Czechs, Slovaks and Ruthenians (Ruthenians).

Dr. Tiso urged Syrový to make prompt appointments of four ministers to assist in administering the new Slovak government from his seat at Bratislava.

The government, meanwhile, advised inhabitants of German-occupied areas of Sudetoland not to be misled by promises of autonomy.

Dr. Tiso, new prime minister of Slovakia, and representatives of the Slovak political parties, came here today to discuss the Slovak role as an autonomous unit in the Czechoslovak federal state.

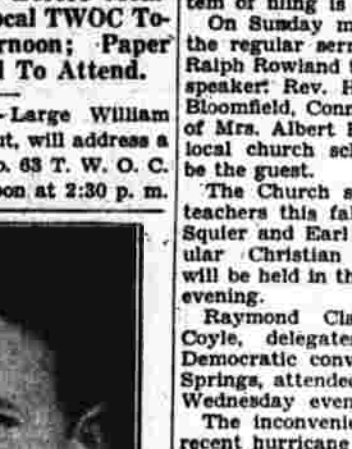
