## HUNDREDS OF CONN. RESIDENTS UNSURE OF CITIZEN STATUS

### American-Born Women Who Married Alien Husbands Between 1907 And 1922 Not Been Reprinted.

Hartford, Oct. 8.—(AP)—Hundreds of American-born women in Connecticut and thousands of them in the country at large are living under an erroneous impression that they are American citizens.

Many vote regularly at the polls although by an ironical twist of federal law they have no right to vote in the land of their birth.

They are the vast army of American women who married foreign-born husbands between March 3, 1907 and Sept. 22, 1922, thereby losing their citizenship and assuming that of their alien spouses, and who have failed to rectify the situation since then by applying for re-naturalization.

### RED CROSS SENDS FLOUR TO SPAIN

#### America's First Large Mercy Erand In Europe After The Post-War Period.

Washington, Oct. 8.—(AP)—The American Red Cross dispatched a stricken Spain today, beginning America's first large scale mercy errand in Europe since the post-war period.

The supplies were loaded aboard the freighter Independence Hall at Hoboken, N. J.

It consisted of 20,000 barrels of flour and 25,000 cases of soap intended to relieve widespread starvation, disease and misery among Spanish civilians, homeless and destitute following nearly two and a half years of civil war.
