Fifty of the 1,500 firemen and volunteers who fought the spectacular blaze through the night remained today to cool the melted tank skeletons so company officials could investigate the cause and estimate the damage. Adequacy of the supply for this purpose depends on three factors: first, provision of an ample supply of water; second, provision of adequate water pressure at the hydrants for fire fighting; and, third, proper spacing of the hydrants so that each building is protected and so that pressure will not be rendered inadequate by the friction caused when water runs through extremely long lengths of

through extremely long lengths of Care of the first two of these fac-tors rests with the state's public water supply system, while the third is a matter in the hands of each community. All three phases of fire protection have been well de-veloped in Connecticut. The water systems have constructed large storage facilities to take advantage

of the varying rainfall in the state, while sufficient pressure at the hydrants has been provided either by Nancy.






