

## FORMER SERGEANT CHANGES HIS PLEA ON SPYING CHARGE

### Rumrich Guilty Declaration Comes Unexpectedly Before Jury Empaneled; Co-Defendants Watch Silently

New York, Oct. 14.—(AP)—A jury of ten men and two women was empaneled in an hour and a half today for the Federal government's trial of three persons accused of being members of a spy ring which sold United States military secrets to a foreign government.

New York, Oct. 14.—(AP)—Gunter Gustav Rumrich, former United States Army sergeant, unexpectedly pleaded guilty to espionage charges in Federal Court today as he was about to go on trial with three other persons, accused of being spies.

Rumrich, alleged by the government to have stolen a military aviation code, was a native of Chicago and the son of German parents. He deserted from the Army in 1935.

He entered his plea as Judge John C. Knox was about to order a jury empaneled for the first important espionage trial in the United States since the World War. Judge Knox deferred sentence until the end of the trial.

Capacity Crowd in Court

The court room was filled to capacity long before Judge Knox, who had been delayed with other legal matters, mounted the bench. Newspaper men and women, including representatives of the more important European journals and a number of "unofficial" observers, jammed the room.

Rumrich's co-defendants, who will also change their plea in a few minutes, are Hans Hofmann, 34-year-old former headmaster of the North German Loyalty League, accused of having acted as a messenger for the spy ring; Otto Herman Voss, 38, a naturalized German formerly employed at Farmingdale Long Island, where American Army engineers are building a structure; and Eric Glaser, 28, another naturalized German who was attached to the United States Army as a private at the Mitchell field aviation base.

Voss is accused of stealing plans for a high-speed pursuit plane. Glaser is charged with a maximum penalty of 20 years imprisonment.

Judge Asks Fatness

Judge Knox pleaded, before opening the questioning of the defendants, for the same fair judgment of the jury as for any American. Other people may become excited but the jury must remain detached.

He asked witnesses whether any member of their families was born in Germany, Austria or Hungary.

Other questions were: "Are any of you in sympathy with the Fascist form of government?" "Are any of you serving in the American Army in the World War?" "Are any of you employed by the U. S. government?"

"Do you belong to any pro-Nazi organization?"

## MIX REFORMS AND CHARGES IN CAMPAIGNS

### Baldwin Advocates Setting Up Systematized Accounting To Curb Shortages By Treasurers in State Towns

Suggested governmental reforms interspersed with accusations and summaries of party achievements formed the political campaign picture in Connecticut today as candidates seeking election strove for an upper hand in November balloting.

Raymond C. Baldwin, Republican nominee for governor, told a party dinner gathering in Bridgeport last night that instances of town treasurers were "all too frequent" in the state.

Baldwin, in advocating setting up a "systematized accounting" of the town of varying size.

Advocates of the reforms said periodic audits of town and city treasurers should be made by a state official in the same manner as the annual Congressional hearings on Treasury appropriations.

## CHURCH BREACH IN VIENNA WIDER

### Nazi Leaders Predict Many Followers Will Withdraw After Anti-Cleric Speech

Buerckel's lecture in Heros' square last night cried "We'll leave the church after he announced: 'If they pray against us in church, then I demand of every individual National Socialist that he have nothing more to do with such a church.'"
