

JAPANESE TROOPS THREATEN CANTON FROM 2 POSITIONS

Terrific Air Bombardments Aid Invaders At Outset Of Second Week Of Offense In South China.

Hongkong, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Japanese columns gathered new momentum today and appeared to have found their way through Chinese defenses to threaten Canton from both the northeast and the east.

Terrific air bombardments aided troops of the invaders at the outset of the second week of the Japanese South China offensive which started Oct. 12.

It was stated authoritatively that one column had reached Shikung on one of four islands in the East river crossed by the Canton-Kowloon railway about 20 miles east of Canton.

To the north, and there were highly conflicting reports on this "back door" phase of the campaign, another mechanized detachment was said to be steadily moving through the mountainous region about 40 miles northeast of the Canton-Kowloon railway.

Still another column was said to be within 20 miles of the Boca Tigra forts, some 50 miles south-east of Canton, which guard the river approach to the metropolis.

Japanese announced that the column which had occupied Tseungshan, 30 miles to the southeast, after an exceptionally heavy air bombardment, and pushed on.

BRITISH CHART PEACE COURSE ON NEW LINES

Also Try To Organize Home Defense And Decide On Pacific Plan In Settling Strife Over Palestine.

London, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain met his cabinet today to chart the British course of peace on the changed European map, try to organize home defense and decide on a Pacific plan in strife-torn Palestine.

A report on the present stage of negotiations for an overdue Anglo-American trade treaty was before the ministers who gathered for the first of two sessions expected this week.

The most pressing matters were reports of the September European crisis showing gaps in British defenses and Italy's 20 September ultimatum to the League of Nations. Chamberlain considered conclusions as to what should be done about the bloody Arab-Jewish strife in the Holy Land, a British mandate.

There was a widespread belief that the cabinet meeting was the premier's determination to consolidate with the new Soviet government by separate agreements with Adolf Hitler. Chamberlain returned to the cabinet after a day's holiday in Scotland.

The cabinet adjourned after a two and a half hour session without reaching a final decision on any of the issues.

Problems facing the cabinet included:

Building up the "Munich peace spirit" before the truce with Germany is reached.

Munich, Germany, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Foreign Minister Joachim von Ribbentrop today conferred with representatives of the new autonomous states of Slovakia and Ruthenia on the Hungarian minority dispute.

The delegation included Dr. Joseph Tiso, prime minister of Slovakia, Dr. Ferdinand Durcovic, minister in Tiso's cabinet, and Edvard Benesky, minister for Ruthenia.

It is an open secret in political circles that Germany is none too pleased with the September crisis which resulted in the creation of Slovakia and Ruthenia as satellite states.

The Prague government has granted the Slovaks and Ruthenians a large measure of autonomy to give them a status of equality with the Czechs.

Hungary according to reports current in Berlin, demands sections of Slovakia in which Hungarians are a minority. They do so on the ground that these areas belonged to Hungary before the World War.

FRENCH BEGIN SESSIONS LOOKING TO NAZI PACT

Hitler Wants Recognition Of Right To Numerical Pre- ponderance In Warplanes; Will Guarantee Frontiers.

Paris, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Preliminary negotiations looking toward a full settlement of differences between France and Germany were reported in informed quarters today.

Premier Edouard Daladier conferred with Count Johannes von Weizsaecker, German ambassador to France, yesterday on the latter's return from Berlin to the latter's request to talk to Foreign Minister Georges Bonnet today.

Both meetings were said by Foreign Office sources to have been arranged at the ambassador's request.

At the same time Andre Francois-Poncet, French ambassador to Berlin, who has been named ambassador to Italy, flew in a special airplane to Berlin to meet Adolf Hitler's invitation to Berchtesgarden, the German chancellery's Bavarian home.

Nazi West Air Supremacy
The first draft of Hitler's terms, which informed sources said were submitted to the French leaders, was reported to include an air pact in which France would recognize Germany's right of numerical preponderance in warplanes.

France also would promise to assure Germany a free hand in central and eastern Europe with the renunciation of her mutual assistance treaty with Soviet Russia.

France would promise to return Togo and the Cameroons, pre-war French colonies, to the Reich.

In return Hitler would guarantee French frontiers against attack.

Although it was believed extremely unlikely such terms would be acceptable to France in their entirety, it was reported by German sources that Daladier was prepared to make an agreement with Hitler soon.

Conditions at the moment with the Czechoslovak issue settled by the Munich partition agreement, were considered favorable from the viewpoints of both Daladier and Hitler.

It seemed a foregone conclusion that the Munich pact would be signed.

WAGE-HOUR LAW EFFECTIVE SOON

Employers Have 4 Days in Which to Complete Preparations For Compliance.

Washington, Oct. 19.—(AP)—Employers have four days in which to complete preparations for complying with the new Federal wage-hour law.

The statute, laying down basic wage standards for 11,000,000 wage-earners in interstate commerce, becomes effective at 12:01 a. m. next Monday.

Before that time thousands of small employers must decide, if they have not already done so, whether they come under the law.

These and many other questions held the attention today not only of the employers but also of Wage-hour Administrator Elmer E. Andrews and his staff of legal, economic and other experts.

Uncertainty has arisen chiefly among firms which produce goods for both interstate and intra-state commerce. Purely intra-state business firms are exempt.

Andrews said it was impossible to lay down a general rule for the industry, but that each case must be determined on its merits. He suggested, however, that any employer who was in doubt should comply.

The first decision rests with the employer, since Andrews' opinion is advisory. Ultimately the courts rather than the administrator will settle the question.

GERMANS RISE TO 3RD IN WORLD AIR RECORDS

Washington, Oct. 19.—(AP)—Germany's creation of a big military air force has been speeded by a steady rise in her position as a leader in aviation.

Reporting this fact today, officials of the National Aeronautics Association said Germany had risen from fifth place among international air record holders on Oct. 1, 1937, to third place on Oct. 1, 1938.

The United States, during the same period, fell from first to fourth place. France took first position during 1937 year, and now holds 4th world records. Italy retained second place.
