



Washington.—It is a safe bet that the fate of Czechoslovakia promoted Prezident Roosevelt's good neighbor policy as much in a short time as could have been accomplished by 10 years of conferences.

Elie Lescot, minister to the United States from the Negro republic of Haiti, called at the State department immediately after the Czechoslovak shouting was over to tell Acting Secretary Sumner Welles how grand his nation felt at being so far away from Europe. Over here, Haiti is safe enough. Off the coast of Europe it might be just another colony to be fought over.
