Dr. Grace Asserts Other Objectives Include Intellectual Competency And Cultural Appreciation.

New Haven, Oct. 28.—(AP)—Dr. James O. Grace, state commissioner of education, stressed the development of civic responsibility and moral integrity as the two main objectives of education in an address today at teachers' convention meetings in New Haven and Bridgeport.

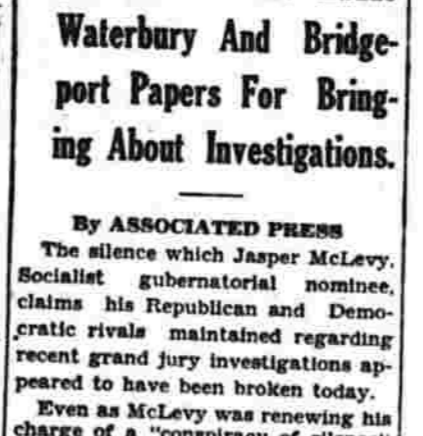

OLD GLASS WORKS WALL DEMOLISHED Historic Site Suffers Further Crumbling Away; Deal Heavy Blow By Gale.

Only the remains of three walls of the ancient Pitkin Glass Works at the corner of Park and Putnam streets have been left standing since the hurricane, which toppled the old stone west wall of the venerable skeleton. 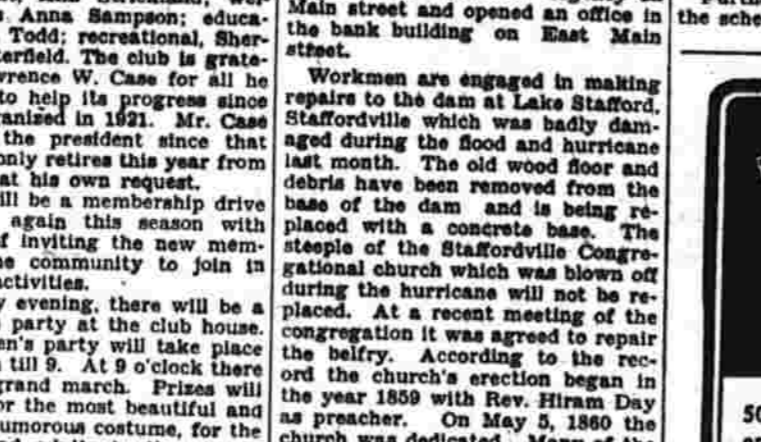

New York, Oct. 28.—(AP)—An attractive woman witness at the German spy trial told a Federal court jury today that she saw Dr. Griebel, a fugitive from the espionage indictment, and Capt. 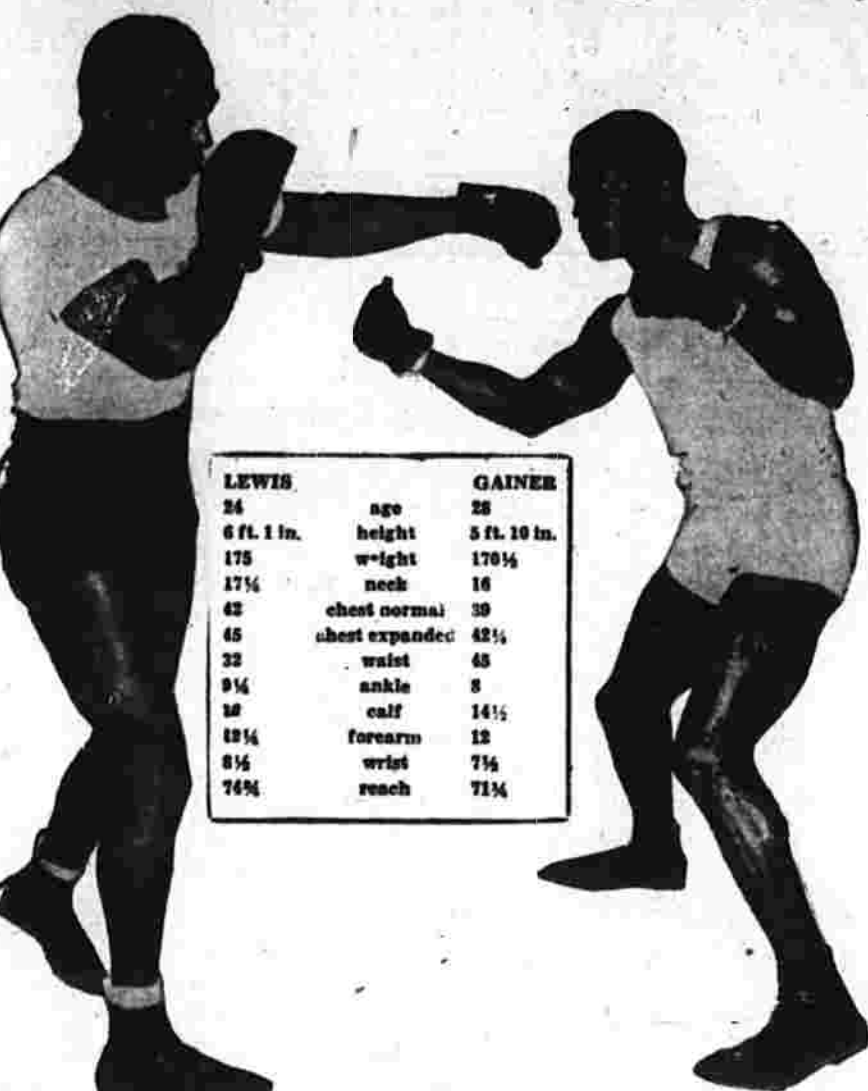

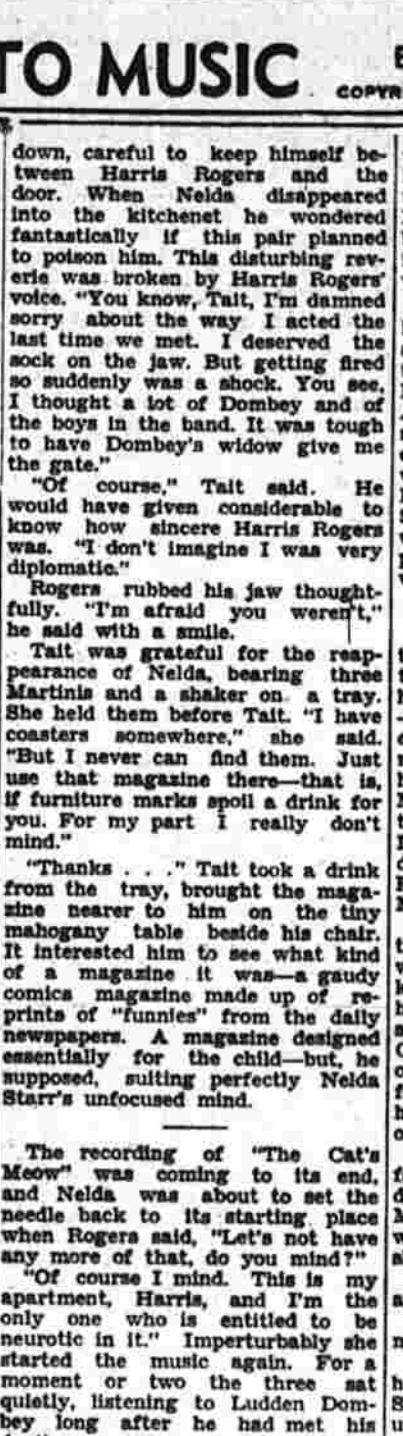

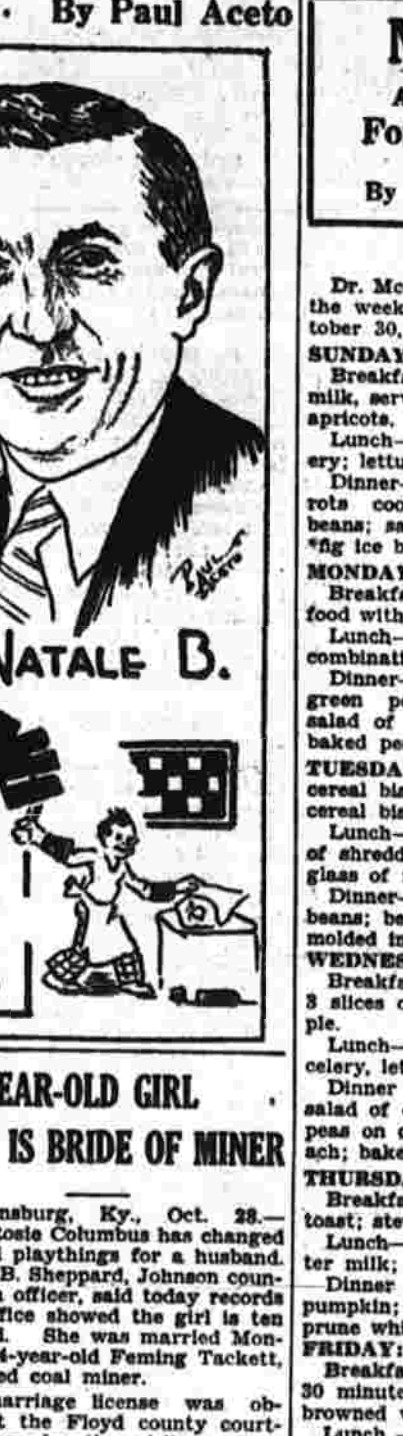
