PARTIES DIFFER IN CONCEPTIONS OF CHIEF ISSUE

While Republicans Present Recovery Democratic And Socialist Speakers Point To Other Matters At Stake

Connecticut citizens could choose today between sharply conflicting conceptions of the principal issue in the state campaign presented by politicians for the leading parties contending for their votes.

Dominating Republican pre-election strategy has been the claim that the "one issue" was "recovery," and to this view has contrasted last night the opinions of Democratic Senator Francis T. Mahoney and Jasper McLevy, Socialist candidate for governor.

Mahoney contended that as in 1932, 1934 and 1936 the "essential question" to be decided in next Tuesday's election was "whether the people of Connecticut are willing to turn back their government to a reactionary Republican machine."

McLevy contended that the dominant issue was "whether the people of Connecticut are willing to support the desperate efforts of the Republican candidates to make it appear that during the past few months they have suddenly become champions of liberalism."

McLevy saw it differently, although he credited Mahoney with dragging "the real issue into the sunlight."

"What Connecticut voters want to know," said the Socialist, "is why was it possible for the 'recovery' uncovered by the Waterbury and Merritt Parkway grand jury investigations 'to have existed over a period of years without the knowledge of men elected to high and trusted state offices?'"

McLevy credited Mahoney with bringing out the "real issue" because in an address Monday night the senator said the Republicans sought to "mislead the people of the Democratic candidates by 'throwing stones' into the grand jury 'cesspools'."

The Bridgeport mayor contended the "spoil and patronage system" was responsible for the conditions uncovered by the grand jury, and he urged the next governor as the remedy, challenged spokesmen for the two major parties to prove where any attempt has been made to eliminate these fundamental conditions.

PLANE, NAVY CARRY BRUNT OF CAMPAIGN

Japanese Depend Upon Two Forces In Extensive Attacks Radiating From Captured City of Canton.

Hongkong, Nov. 2.—(AP)—Japanese Air and Naval forces today bore the brunt of the extensive campaign radiating from the captured Southern China city of Canton.

Japanese planes in an attack on Sheki killed 50 and wounded 60, incendiary bombs started a number of fires and houses were damaged extensively. The injured were taken across the mouth of the Canton river to Hongkong.

Canton dispatches indicated Japanese naval forces and infantry detachments were pushing steadily west from Shiehing, 35 miles south and west of Canton itself.

Reports not officially confirmed said the British gunboat Robin and four river steamers carrying women and children refugees from Whchow to Canton were bottled in the West River there. They were caught between a boom laid across the river by Chinese and dangerous mines.

Beltsford Canton Falls
Chinese heard more than 10,000 troops arrived at Amoy, southern port in Fukien province, to reinforce Canton units, and similarly the Japanese garrison at Penglingta, Southern Shensi, had been increased preparatory to a new drive into Shensi province, North China.

Details still were lacking of a statement by Chiang Kai-shek.

F. D. R. INTERESTED IN SEVEN STATES

Fair Cross-Section of Way Country Is Thinking Provided by Vote in Group.

Washington, Nov. 2.—(AP)—If the signs mean what they mean, President Roosevelt's chief interest in next Tuesday's voting lies in seven states.

Others have caught his attention at one time or another since Congress went home, but his interest in that group was pretty well blotted out by the primaries.

Those in which he has taken an active interest, and thus has made himself something of a factor in the voting, would provide a fair cross-section of the way the country is thinking—all of it except the south. He learned about some of the southern states in the primaries.

By letters, conferences and words dropped at different times since state primaries, Mr. Roosevelt has put himself on the line for certain Democratic candidates in New York, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Ohio, California, Iowa, and Wisconsin.

Of themselves, these states do not have the power to make, or keep, any man president. But in any primary election they are the nucleus in which any overturn of electoral college results is called for.

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The sudden shift in cabinet posts which Bernard and Marnand announced swapped jobs as justice and finance ministers resulted, politicians observed, from deep-seated differences over the nature of methods to be applied for financial and economic recovery.

Moderate, experienced, middle-aged Paul Reynaud, who succeeded Paul Marchandeau as finance minister after a short-lived tenure, cancelled all his engagements and declared he would devote himself to solving the nation's economic puzzle.

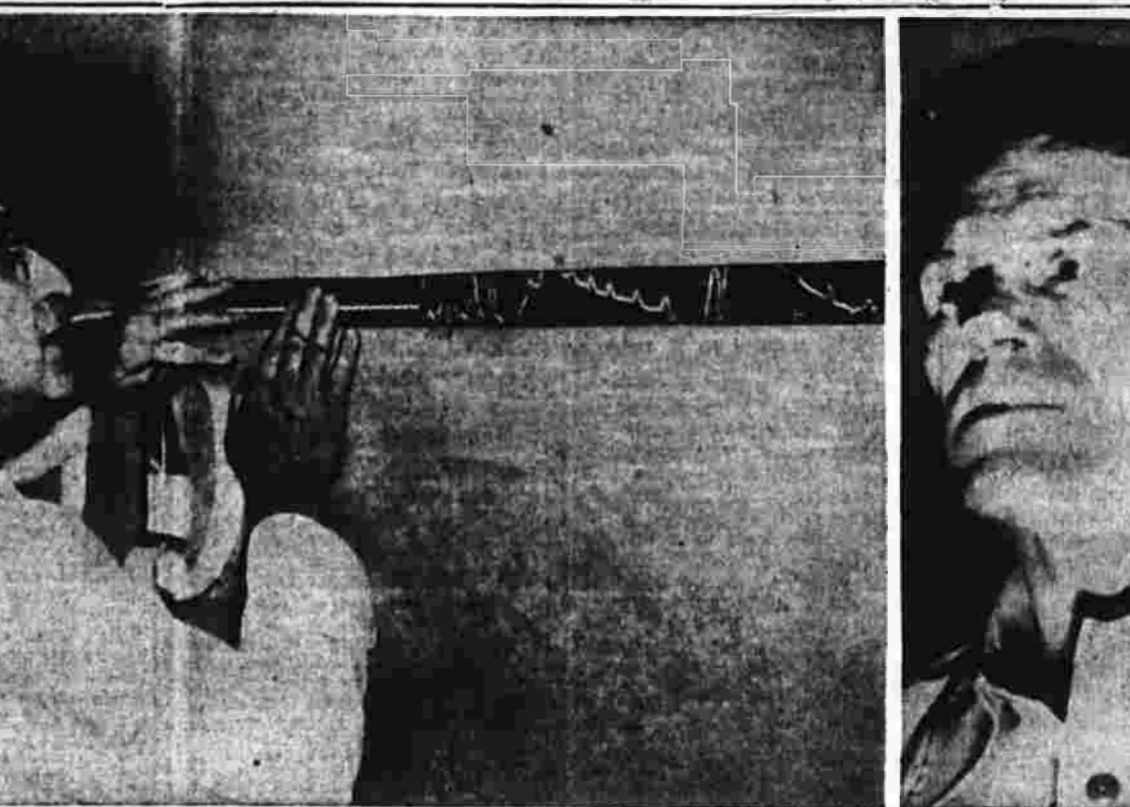

DECLARES SPANISH WAR NO LONGER IS MENACE

Chamberlain Demands Parliament Approve Conclusion of Friendship Accord With Mussolini

London, Nov. 2.—(AP)—Prime Minister Chamberlain declared today that the Spanish war is no longer a menace to the peace of Europe and demanded that Parliament approve the conclusion of his friendly pact with Premier Mussolini.

He based his argument for this action, which would let him continue his search for general European agreement, on the proposals:

1. The authority for additional armaments and mergers of railroads.

2. Greater flexibility in valuing government loans for carriers on both short and long terms.

These suggestions are listed in legislative programs of the Association of American Railroads, the Railway Labor Executives' Association, the Interstate Commerce Commission and the President's Emergency Board which recommended that the carriers abandon an announced 15 per cent wage cut.

President Roosevelt received the suggestions from the railroads and their representatives Monday and he is expected to announce his definite proposals for him to lay before Congress. He, in turn, was reported to have pledged his support to a general rail program.

SAYS VOSS TOLD OF PLANE PLANS

FBI Agent Corroborates Testimony Given By Turron Of Spy's Confession.

Washington, Nov. 2.—(AP)—An agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation corroborated at the German spy trial today testimony that Otto Hermann Voss admitted after his arrest that he gave airplane secrets to German agents.

A statement quoting Voss, aviation mechanic and one of the three persons on trial, as saying he was "for Germany" and not in hope any money" and read into the record Monday.

Leon G. Turron, former FBI agent and witness in charge of the espionage investigation, testified that Voss gave the statement voluntarily.

Also in Questioning
The corroborating witness, William T. Banister, now in charge of the FBI, said he added Turron in questioning Voss at headquarters here and his statement on the line.

"Voss said all his acts were 'for Germany' and not in hope any money," Banister said.

Opening of the day's session was delayed by a slight indisposition of a juror. Indications were that the government would complete its case against Voss, Erich Gless, U. S. army private, and Johanna Hoffmann, his wife, by the first part of next week, if not before.

Ernest Davis, FBI agent now in charge of the Knoxville, Tenn., division, told of accompanying Turron to the Beverly airplane plant in Farmington, where they arrested Voss at his workshop.

Excavation May Settle Shakespeare Argument

London, Nov. 2.—(AP)—Workmen's apes dug today at the 340-year-old secret of who wrote Shakespeare's masterpieces.

The doors of historic Westminster Abbey were locked, dim lights flickered inside and a policeman kept the curious away as an expedition to open the tomb is R. L. Eagle, an insurance man and convinced Shakespearean.

BRANDS JAIL SYSTEM OF STATE DISCREDIT IN REPORT TO CROSS

Three Major Recommendations Made By Legislative Commission; Urges Assembly Appropriate Cash For Land, Buildings, Running Expenses Of Farm.

Hartford, Nov. 2.—(AP)—The legislative commission on jails, branding the present Connecticut jail system "a new completely discredited system that has aided materially in enlarging the so-called criminal class," submitted today to the House a new set of recommendations.

The five-man commission also recommended that for the establishment of the jail farm, the General Assembly appropriate \$50,000 for the purchase of land, \$200,000 for construction of the buildings and running expenses, and \$40,000 for equipment.

The other two major recommendations of the commission were that existing jails be used mainly for the detention of arrested persons awaiting trial, and that all women prisoners who are sentenced to be committed to the State Farm for Work at East Lyme, rather than to the State Farm, be sent there.

The commission also recommended that the State Farm be established as a state farm for the confinement of convicted prisoners.

OHIO GOVERNOR ORDERS TROOPS READY IN ROW

Daivy Declares He Will Not Permit Lawless Invasion Of Middletown In Connection With Tobacco Strike.

Columbus, O., Nov. 2.—(AP)—Gov. Martin L. Daivy, declaring he would "not permit the lawless invasion of Middletown," said today "it may be necessary to send troops" there in connection with a strike at the P. Lorillard Co. tobacco plant.

The commission for Industrial Organization union called a strike at the plant Oct. 3 and a week ago there was a skirmish at the plant between workers seeking to return to their jobs and union members and sympathizers.

Daivy declared the incident as a "serious riot" during which "CIO pickets assaulted other employees, including some elderly women, and he said a reign of terrorism has been inaugurated in a peaceful community."

Troops Availed Development
Daivy ordered the State Police to a statement to the press, have been placed "on notice" and are awaiting developments.

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SAYS DEMOCRACY FACES CHALLENGE

Free Press, Schools And Judiciary Necessary For Preservation Of Status.

Chicago, Nov. 2.—(AP)—H. G. Hatfield, of Oklahoma City, president of the National Education Association today declared democracy was imperiled and that its preservation was possible only through a free press, free schools and an unshackled judiciary.

The maintenance of the democratic concept of government is threatened today as never before," he declared in a speech prepared for delivery to officers attending the annual four-day council meeting of the organization.

President Hatfield urged the use of "every proper means" to combat the theories of Communism and Fascism "being expounded" by those who would disintegrate our form of government.

"We must stand for the continuance of a free church," he said. "One of the first acts of a dictator is to either close the church or control it through the church of control."
