



Must Cut Costs

"Elighty-eight out of every hundred New Deal voters of 1936, and 96 out of every hundred Republican voters believe that the costs of government should be decreased. The comments that accompanied these answers indicate how strong

these answers indicate how strong the feeling is about government expenditures. Taxes are too high now, 'Our children and grandchildren will be paying for the spending of the last six years', and 'Will anything but bankruptcy stop this spending?' were typical of the comments that were found throughout the whole lot of 4,365 questionsaires.

"The most complete agreement among the New Deal voters of 1936 on any question in the survey was recorded on the question of expenditures beyond the income of the Government, with 95 out of every hundred 1936 Democrats insisting on the necessity of the policy of 'payas-s-you go.' Reflecting the traditional policy of Connecticut and of New England, the comments of those interviewed on this question were typical.' The business, borrowing too much leads to bankruptcy. The same thing can happen to government if we over-extend our credit.' The greatest evils of business in the post-war era are now being practiced by the Government—too much spending on credit."

"The questionnaires have been tabulated by a non-partisan statistical organization."


