

14 PERSONS MEET DEATH AS BRITISH AIRLINER CRASHES

Fully Loaded Passenger Plane Falls Into Field On Island Of Jersey Shortly After Its Takeoff.

St. Helier, Island of Jersey, Nov. 4.—(AP)—Fourteen persons were killed today in one of Britain's worst airplane disasters when a fully-loaded passenger airliner crashed in a field just after taking off for Southampton, England.

The victims were nine men, four women and one child, including the pilot, Capt. A. G. M. Cary, the wireless operator, 11 passengers and a man working in the field where the plane crashed.

The plane was on a regular run between Jersey, in the English channel, and Southampton.

BALDWIN VOWS PARTY TO HELP PROTECT LABOR

CROSS MAY TALK OVER NEW BRIDGE

Span Across Connecticut Indicated As Subject To Be Discussed With Roosevelt

Hartford, Nov. 4.—(AP)—A special session of the General Assembly soon after the Nov. 8 election appeared inevitable today as state and federal officials moved towards realization of plans for a new bridge over the Connecticut river, but over the Connecticut river, White Governor Cross disapproved the project with President Roosevelt in a luncheon visit to Hyde Park, N. Y. It was learned that the New York office of the WPA had approved the \$7,000,000 bridge program. The project, however, was forwarded to Washington for final approval with the condition that the \$200,000 in state funds be made available early so that construction of the bridge may begin no later than Dec. 31 of this year.

HURRICANE WORK REPORT ISSUED

Hewes Tells Of Distributing 44,000 Circulars On Relief And 8,000 Inquiries.

Hartford, Nov. 4.—(AP)—Col. Thomas Hewes, state coordinator, submitted today to Governor Cross a report on the activities of his office, created Sept. 28 shortly after the hurricane.

The report said that Hewes' office, serving as a clearing house for information concerning relief, distributed throughout the state 44,000 circulars describing the work and the WPA's part in the relief work. It also handled 8,000 inquiries.

EASTERN STATES GET MOST MONEY

New York And Pennsylvania Lead In Obtaining Outright Gifts Of PWA Funds.

Washington, Nov. 4.—(AP)—New York and Pennsylvania have led all states in obtaining outright gifts of 1938 PWA funds, according to a report today from the Federal Public Works Administration.

An October recapitulation of public works authorizations since the beginning of the program June 27, 1938 in grants for 246 projects, Pennsylvania received \$3,909,641 in grants for 254 projects, the largest number of non-federal projects.
