

### POWERS REPORTED PLANNING PROTEST ON JAPANESE ACTS

United States, Great Britain and France Preparing to Question Barring Trade in Yangtze Valley.

Shanghai, Nov. 5.—(AP)—The United States, Great Britain and France were reported by reliable sources today to be preparing new protests against being barred from the rich Yangtze valley while Japanese merchants were laying foundations for economic monopolies.

Japanese spokesmen insisted that military necessity required that the Yangtze be made virtually a Japanese river and there was no prospect that the ban would be lifted.

Japanese commercial interests also started establishing trade connections in South China.

London dispatches said Japanese merchant ships had begun arriving at Canton, although foreign shipping still was barred from the Pearl river and there was no prospect that the ban would be lifted.

A Japanese spokesman said traders going to Hankow and Canton were "limited to furnishing goods to the Japanese navy and army" and insisted they were not engaging in public business.

Meanwhile, fighting continued on numerous fronts, the heaviest action being around Hankow and in South China.

Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek, with a group of Soviet Russian advisers more than 100 new tanks and Russian-strengthened artillery, was said to have chosen South Hunan province as a base for a new stand against the Japanese.

To back up this new phase of resistance the Chinese will have an air base in Yunan, southwesternmost province of China, where American instructors are training young airmen to expand the small force of Chinese planes.

### Finds Relics of Hitherto Unknown American Race

Washington, Nov. 5.—(AP)—Dr. they showed unmistakably that long before the Aleut race moved out of Asia the earlier people had been moving slowly eastward to what is now Alaska, Canada, the United States and Boston.

They apparently started from Asia at least 3,000 years ago, he said, and succeeding generations eventually reached the southern part of North America.

"They were at least closely related to the ancestors of the tribes occupying the Pacific coast at the time of the first white explorations," the Smithsonian scientist said.

### TO OPEN NAVY YARD IN SOUTH IDLE 17 YEARS

Revival of New Orleans Plant, War Factories Is Part of Defense Activity; May Keep Fleet in Atlantic

Washington, Nov. 5.—(AP)—The administration's decision to reopen the New Orleans navy yard, inoperative since 1921, gave fresh impetus today that the "temporary" Atlantic squadron, created last September, might become a permanent sea force.

Only last spring, Admiral William D. Leahy, chief of naval operations, told a House committee that the Atlantic coast that was needed. At that time, however, the fleet was concentrated in the Pacific. Since then, 38 vessels have been organized into the Atlantic squadron. In the meantime, too, there has been official concern over the possibility that the totalitarian states might be able to dominate the South America. This concern was reflected in President Roosevelt's reiteration of the principles of the Monroe doctrine.

To Open Ordnance Plant

President Roosevelt announced at Hyde Park, N. Y., yesterday the administration's intention to reopen the New Orleans yard. He also said steps were being taken to cut down delays in the construction of war ordnance plant at the Gulf and from the Atlantic to the Mississippi watershed.

### SAVANNAH PLANS MUSIC BATTLE TESTING VIOLIN

Experiments of Three Years Convince Scientist Tone of Cheaper Instruments Equal Famed Stradivarius

Cambridge, Mass., Nov. 5.—(AP)—In a Harvard physics laboratory today, the stage was set for a strange battle of music between a university scientist and a world-famous violinist for the "honor" of the king of violins, the Stradivarius.

One "contestant" was Harvard's Dr. Frederick A. Saunders, whose experiments over a period of three years have led him to believe "you can get the same tone from a cheap instrument as much as from a Stradivarius and other instruments of the master maker."

The other—his hoped-would be violinist, Jascha Heifetz, owner of a Strad and Guarneria which are both listed in all catalogues of famous violins. Heifetz will arrive in Boston today for two concerts next week.

Into his lab with its "ton of equipment," Dr. Saunders said he expected to have Heifetz come with his two violins and play for science.

Makes "Photographic" Analyses

"So far," said the professor, "we have been using the professor's own violin (himself) during his experiments, which consist of making 'photographic' analyses of tones produced by the violin."

### RAIN CHECK FOREST FIRES IN 16 STATES

Damage To Timber Stands And Farm Crops Estimated In Hundreds Of Thousands In Blazing Area.

Forest fires consumed timber on additional thousands of acres today but rains checked the spread of flames in many sections of the South and West.

Drenching rains in the South broke a prolonged drought and helped control hundreds of blazes which permanent relief depended upon continued precipitation.

The damage to timber stands and farm crops estimated in the hundreds of thousands. The fire area extended from Michigan to the Gulf and from the Atlantic to the Mississippi watershed.

A hundred major fires and uncounted small ones raged in West Virginia where, States Forester D. H. Griffin said, the flames had the fiercest "back against the wind."

A 1600 mile area—one-fourth of the United States—was in flames. Nearly 3,000 men were on duty.
