FOUR PERSONS DIE IN BOLTON CRASH; 2 SERIOUSLY HURT

Four Others Injured In Accident Caused When Local Car Skids At Overpass, Crashes Another.

JAPANESE PAVE WAY FOR RECONSTRUCTION OF WAR-TORN AREAS

Form Central China Development Company; President Of New Concern Gives Assurance Japan Has No Intention Of Monopolizing Commerce.

Tokyo, Nov. 7.—(AP)—The Japanese government paved the way for reconstruction of war-devastated areas of central China today when it formed the Central China Development Company, twin of the North China Development Company.

At the same time Kenji Kodama, president of the newly formed company, gave assurance that Japan had no intention of monopolizing commerce in China of interfering with existing or future foreign enterprises.

"We have no idea of monopoly," Kodama said. "We will not interfere with foreign interests already existing in central China nor will we oppose new foreign investments provided they are offered in the spirit of friendly cooperation."

The new holding company, which was incorporated today, was capitalized at 100,000,000 yen (about \$7,700,000).

Kodama said the company would not solicit foreign financial aid, adding that "we are not in a position to do that."

"We have no intention of monopolizing commerce in China of interfering with existing or future foreign enterprises," Kodama said.
