

ARMISTICE DAY IS MARKED HERE WITH FITTING CEREMONY

Veterans Remember 20th Anniversary Of World War's End With Parade And Exercises At Hospital

Manchester's veterans and friends again remembered those who made the supreme sacrifices on the field of battle and at sea in the World War today on the 20th anniversary of the Armistice. Perfect weather aided in carrying out all details of the observance, the parade at 9:30 a. m., the testimonials of the surviving buddies and memorial exercises at the hospital monument at 11 o'clock.

In spite of continuation of general business and industry throughout the town, which deprived many of attending the ceremonies, one of the largest groups of veterans in the hospital for the exercises commemorating the passage of two decades since warfare ceased at the front in France.

Start of Parade
The parade started from Main and Forest streets at 9:30 and headed north on Main street, continuing to Depot Square and then crossing to Haynes street and Main where the veterans passed through marching units to the hospital. Captain John Penland was Marshal assisted by aides from the various reserve units. The parade was reviewed at the Center by Selectmen and other town officials.

Major John C. Mahoney opened the exercises at the hospital with words of greeting to veterans and friends in attendance. The Anderson-Shaw Post, V. F. W., band played the "Foot and Peasant" overture, an unusual accomplishment for a military band, and Rev. K. Richter offered prayer.

EMBARGO AIDS JAPS IN WAR AGAINST CHINA

Americans In Shanghai Receive Reports Of Action By French Authorities In Indo China On Supplies.

Shanghai, Nov. 11.—(AP)—American firms in Shanghai receive reports today that French authorities in Indo China had imposed an embargo against the importation of war supplies destined for the Japanese.

It was said the embargo, undertaken to remove friction with the French that they are not war supplies.

Twenty years after the war to end war an anxious world paused today to reflect on peace and disillusionment.

A new generation, with only dim memories of the World War and the great joy of the Armistice, already has grown to fighting age.

It comes to maturity through years of struggle against the devastation of past war, amid new wars and preparations for more war, amid weakness of democratic and growing power of dictatorship.

"The situation in the world today is as menacing as at any critical time in its history," declared J. P. Fehring, who led the American forces in France.

INONU CHOSEN TURKISH HEAD BY ASSEMBLY

New Leader Premier 13 Of 15 Years Ataturk Ruled; Resigning Cabinet Expected To Be Reconstituted.

Ankara, Turkey, Nov. 11.—(AP)—Gen. Inonu was elected by the National Assembly today to succeed his late friend and long-time comrade, Kemal Ataturk, as president of Turkey.

Ataturk, who died yesterday, once said of Inonu—a reformer and strong man in his own right—that "he is my comrade, he is always with me, he is always with me."

The new leader, known as the "Ataturk of the East," is 53 years of age and has served in the cabinet for 13 of the 15 years that Ataturk ruled the state.

F.D.R. SATISFIED WITH RETURNS

Does Not Believe Results Constitute Any Threat To 'Liberal Government.'

Washington, Nov. 11.—(AP)—President Roosevelt said today he did not believe the results of last Tuesday's elections constituted any threat to the continuation of "liberal government."

At a press conference, Mr. Roosevelt declared he thought the election returns were an endorsement of the liberal government.

A questioner, referring to the voting which resulted in heavy losses for the Democrats in the House and the Senate, asked Mr. Roosevelt whether he believed the outcome of the voting would result in a heavy Democratic loss and Republican gain, constituting a threat to the continuation of "liberal government."

DEPUTY WARDEN IN BAD CONDITION

Victim Of Prison Escape Gun Battle In Which Convict Is Killed, Five Shot.

Nashville, Tenn., Nov. 11.—(AP)—Deputy Warden C. C. Woods of the state penitentiary remained in a critical condition today, the victim of a prison escape gun battle in which one convict was killed and five others shot.

Two guards, killed yesterday along with Woods and forced to accompany the fugitives, were wounded and state police and prison officials captured the prisoners less than an hour after they sped through the penitentiary gates in a commandeered truck.

Fugitives From Woods
Woods, paralyzed from the waist down by a bullet that entered his back, also was shot in the forehead and arm.

WARNS JEWS BEHAVIOR TO DETERMINE FUTURE

Restoration Of Ghetto In Germany Predicted As Goebbels Says Restrictions Being Prepared.

Berlin, Nov. 11.—(AP)—Secretary of Propaganda Joseph Goebbels today warned Jews of Germany that their behavior as well as that of German Jews would determine future treatment of Jews in the Reich.

He said that new restrictive laws and decrees were being prepared and would be issued "during the next few days."

Other Nazis predicted restoration of the ghetto for the Jews of Germany under the decrees promulgated by Reichsfuhrer Hitler as part of a general anti-Semitic campaign.

PARADE VETERANS HURT
Houston, Tex., Nov. 11.—(AP)—A small bomb, scheduled to be used as a signal to halt an Armistice day parade for a moment of prayer, exploded in a crowd of about 10,000 people today, injuring several persons.

Two children and a woman were taken to a hospital for treatment. Cuts caused by fragments from the bomb, however, estimated to be about 10,000 fighting planes.

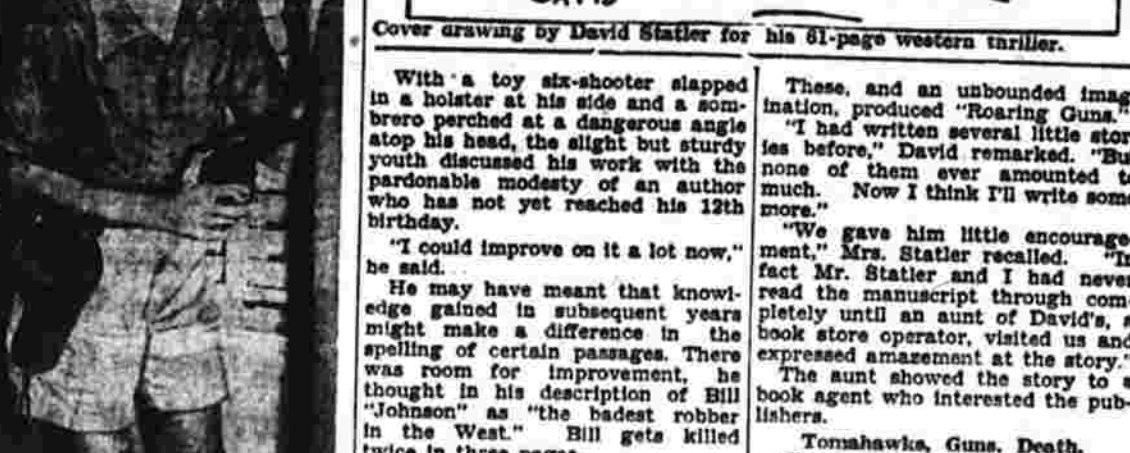

EARTHQUAKE CAUSES HAWAIIAN TIDAL WAVE

Honolulu, Nov. 11.—(AP)—A severe earthquake, apparently centered yesterday in the Pacific ocean between the Aleutian and Hawaiian islands, sent tremors throughout Alaskan communities and a small tidal wave against Hawaiian island shores. There were no reports of damage.
The tidal wave, estimated by Lt.-Commander J. H. Peters of the U. S. Coast Geodetic Survey to have traveled at a speed of 450 miles an hour, caused a maximum rise and fall of nine inches in Honolulu harbor's water level, starting at 3 p. m. (8:30 p. m. e. s. t.) more than four hours after the first movement, imperceptible to persons scanning the harbor, reached a peak about 4:30 p. m. and then began subsiding.

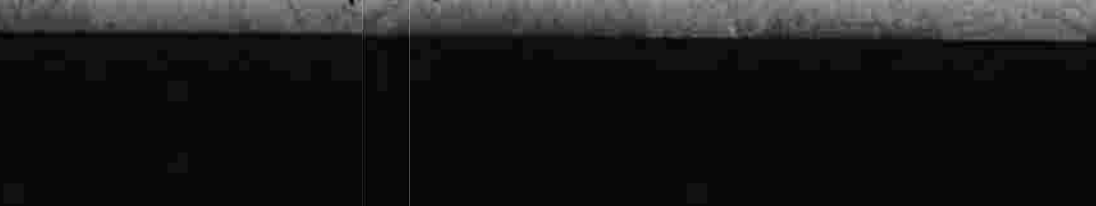

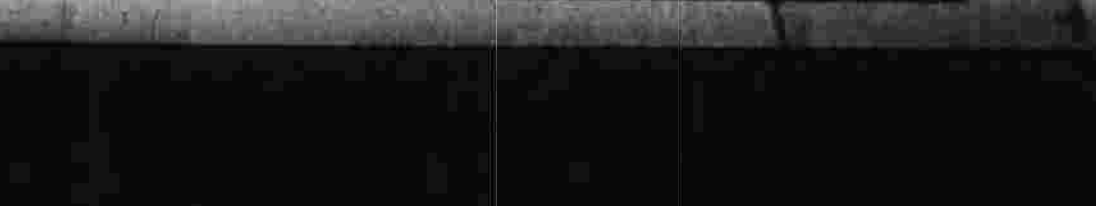

Both of these men are Republicans. In town, the town court may undergo a change in officials.

Under the first terms of Governor Cross, Republicans remained in their court offices here, finally being removed to be replaced by Democrats.

It is rumored that some young Republican attorneys are being pushed for appointment when the terms of the present officials expire next July.
