The 26th Division was made up entirely of the National Guard of New England. When it left the United States every man was a volunteer. Tens of thousands of replacements were made from the National Army, but most of these men were from Western states. And of course many of the new officers halfed from other parts of the country. When hostilities ceased hardly 15 per cent of them remained. The names of most of the others are in the casualty lists.

Camp Training

Made up of good New England Che, men from all walks of life, in cliviation was inducted into federal, service on July 25, 1917. From that date to the period of September 7th to October 9th, when the division embarked overseas, an intensive period of training welded the various units of national guardsmen into a well regulated, combat division of which the Germans later said, "The 26th American Division is a fighting five front."

When the time for leaving the homeland came, the troops were moved secretly to various points of embarkation. The first units to go left Hoboken arriving in France September 21, 1917; others went to Virginia to embark, and the Niantic troops used the Central Vermont railroad to Montreal and then by White Star Line boats down the St. Lawrence, and eventually out of Halifax, thence to Liverpool and Southampton, and finally to La Havre, the last units to reach France, Oct. 30, 1917.





AIM FOR CARACTER

The school of the future will consider character training a major aim of instruction, and teachers uniformly will bend their efforts toward the end that instruction will be a matter of teaching the child and not subject matter.

That character training emphasis is important is evidenced by statics which show that 100,000 young people between the ages of 18 and 25 are yearly incarcerated in penitentiaries to atone for crimes of every description. Where today are the million children who in the next ten years will be apprehended by the law? They are now between the ages of eight and fifteen and are sitting in our classroom awaiting the opportunity which schools of the future more and more emphasis will be picaced upon the cultivation of habits of self-direction and self-control through opportunities given for practicing. Drill on this phase of instruction will be as necessary as drill on academic skills, and students will be allowed to make mistakes through the correction of which a stronger personality may be developed. Subscription to this ideal will advance the honor system in examination, preparation of assignments, and in study hall groups. 




