## COURT WILL HEAR RECOUNT CLAIMS IN FIFTH DISTRICT

### Rice, Defeated Republican Nominee, Asks Inspection Of Rejected Ballots And Order Eliminating Vote.

Waterbury, Nov. 12.—(AP)—A dispute over the vote for United States representative in the Fifth Congressional district will be aired Tuesday morning at hearing in Hartford before three justices of the Supreme Court of Errors.

Leut. Col. Roy E. Rice, the defeated Republican nominee, will ask for a recount of the vote in several towns, an inspection of rejected ballots and an order throwing out the entire vote for congressman in the city of Derby.

On the basis of unofficial returns Rice was defeated by J. Joseph Smith, the Democratic incumbent, by the slim margin of 294 votes. Over 78,000 votes were cast.
