MAKE-UP OF PANEL OF PARKWAY JURY CAUSES ARGUMENT

conspiracy and his counsel immediately challenged the make-up of the jury panel, claiming there was "no reasonable distribution" of veniremen from cities and small towns.

In his challenge Kemp pointed out that of the panel of 25 only one venireman came from Bridgeport, none from Newark, four from Stamford and two from Greenwich, a total of seven from the four largest communities in the county.

Compared to this, he said, there were 11 veniremen from Easton, eight from Monroe, nine from Fairfield and six from Shelton, all relatively small towns.

Arguing for business men Kemp argued further that if Kemp was "to be tried by a jury of his peers," the jury should have in its membership business men, and such professionals as contractors, accountants and auditors.

The defense counsel said, however, that the jury would be selected from a list of names compiled by the court.

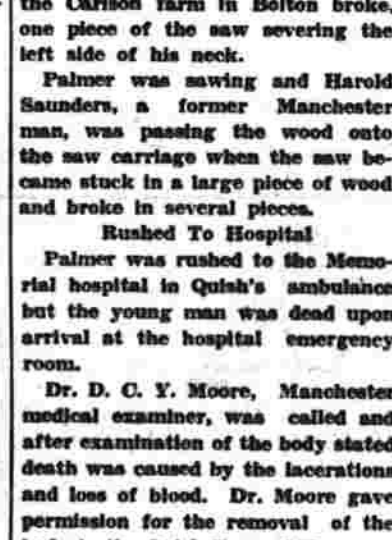

CHRISTMAS CLUB CHECKS HERE TO TOTAL \$90,000

Over 2,500 Residents To Share, Many More Than Last Year And \$10,000 More In Cash.

The Savings Bank of Manchester will distribute \$90,000 in checks to 2,543 members of the 1938 Christmas Club, it was announced today by Thomas K. Clarke, secretary of the bank. Both the amount saved during the past year and the number of accounts on the books are considerably higher than in previous years. The club runs a very close check on the amount of money saved during the past year. The club has been in operation since 1924, and has saved in all amounts of fifty cents, one dollar, two dollars and five dollars weekly.

Last year \$50,000 was distributed to about 1,900 members. In 1938 the amount was \$40,000 to 1,078 members, so that this year's totals represent a marked increase in this popular method of saving. It is estimated that about thirty per cent of the amount in this year's club will be returned to the members as Christmas accounts.
