





Application of sanctions, in the event of an attack by an outside power on any Latin American country, would enable the Pan-American states to help the United States in enforcing the Monroe doctrine.

If the Lima conference agrees on a definition of the aggressor and on application of sanctions, it will have gone farther than any previous Pan-American conference. Significantly, both Brazil and Bolivia also have submitted methods for ascertaining who is the aggressor in a conflict between nations, and a definition is one some force of these negotiations.
