Middle West Navigation System Near Completion

Washington, Nov. 29.—(AP)—Improvements of the Mississippi waterways were among 382 separate projects the Army engineers had carried out during the fiscal year which ended June 30. Their work included, gulf, lake and inland rivers and harbors, and on intracoastal and inland waterways one g 600-mile, nine-foot deep channel from the mouth of the Missouri to the Gulf of Mexico, more than 11 per cent finished.
