Borah Predicts Popular Sentiment Will Force Congress To Approve Constitutional Amendment.

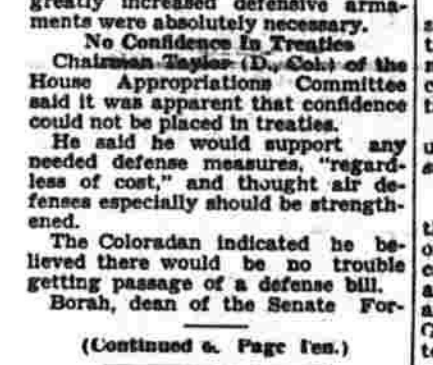

PAID A MINISTER \$500 FOR ACCESS TO CLIENT

Cooke Testifies To Dividing \$32,814 Commissions With Kemp In Land Deals; Pastor Refuses Comment

Bridgeport, Dec. 3.—(AP)—Testimony to the effect that G. Leroy Kemp, while acting as the State Highway Department's land purchasing agent in securing a right of way for the Merritt Parkway, divided \$32,814 in commissions with Thomas N. Cooke, who is a Jewish resident in the area most recently purchased by the highway department, was heard today in superior court records today.

Cooke, on the stand five hours yesterday, said under cross examination that neither he nor Kemp believed there was anything "wrong" in their dealing. On his biggest purchase of 141 acres, Cooke said he was introduced to his client by Rev. Mr. Brown, who he paid \$500. He referred to the clergyman as "Mr. Brown."

GERMAN SPY CASE MARKED "CLOSED"

Four Principal Actors To Serve Prison Terms Up To Six Years For Efforts

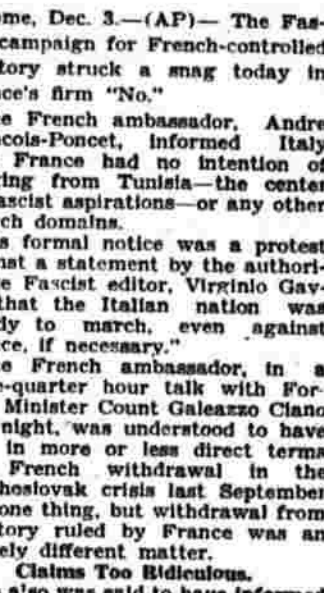
New York, Dec. 3.—(AP)—The nation's greatest spy case since the World War was marked "closed" today as four principal actors facing prison terms up to six years for their spying activities at espionage with their conviction today. Information by Nazi Germany, Federal Judge John Knox commented that the principal result of their efforts was to stir up public resentment against the government of a great people.

ITALIAN ANSWER MAY BLOCK FRENCH PEACE PACT WITH GERMANY

Fascist Drive For Territory Strikes Snag When French Ambassador Reveals Nation Has No Intention Of Giving Up Tunisia Or Any Other Lands.

Rome, Dec. 3.—(AP)—The Fascist campaign for French-controlled territory struck a snag today in France's answer.

The French ambassador, Andre Francois-Poncet, informed Italy today that France had no intention of yielding Tunisia—the center of Fascist aspirations—or any other French domains.

His formal notice was a protest against a statement by the authoritative Fascist editor, Vittorio Gavali, that the Italian nation was ready to march, even against France, if necessary.

UNSATISFACTORY REPLY TO DEMANDS FOR EXPLANATION OF FASCIST CAMPAIGN FOR AFRICAN TERRITORY WOULD END HOPE FOR COMPLETING ACCORD, OFFICIALS SAY.

Paris, Dec. 3.—(AP)—French officials left no doubt today that an unsatisfactory Italian answer to France's demands for "explanation" of a Fascist campaign for French-controlled territory would end all hope for completing the Franco-German war renegotiation pact.

France asked Italy to make her position known by Monday night. The time limit gave her request some of the aspect of an ultimatum since it was made known Italy's answer might determine France's attitude toward other European problems.

Source close to the Foreign Ministry said the Italian Foreign Minister Count Galeazzo Ciano told the French Ambassador Andre Francois-Poncet during their conversation in Rome yesterday that the Italian government assumed no responsibility for the demonstration in the Italian Chamber of Deputies on Wednesday.

These sources said this reply was generally considered unsatisfactory since the Italian government was nothing to prevent the demonstration and because of recent articles in the government controlled Fascist press.

The situation, already involving all of Europe's "big four," arose as a general shipping strike in Le Havre delayed the sailing of the liner Normandie despite a government order repositing all of the 20 vessels in the company.

Wilds Have No Terrors For This Local Youth

Edward J. Olander Of Mill Street Tells Of Adventures In Northern Canada And Alaska; Hunted And Trapped With Former Local Youth, Miles From Civilization.

Many are of the opinion that there are no great frontiers left—no frontiers against which man in his quest for new adventure, may scale to appear that call of the wild that comes over most of us at times. One need not talk long with Edward J. Olander of Mill street, this town, to realize that there are plenty such wild open spaces where a man, if he seeks Nature in the raw, may find his fill. At least did young Olander, both in the northern reaches of Canada and again in our own Alaskan Territory. Which all makes up for an accounting of what the young and sometimes called "so-called" generation can and has done in recent times to escape boredom.

Trade School Graduate To begin, Olander is a graduate of the State Trade school, machine dimension, class of 1937. He was a bright student and received his regular diploma and received his regular diploma of graduation. Others stayed on for the exercises in June, but not Olander. He had heard the call of the wild and with another boy, Robert Haar, of Hartford, formerly of this town, he started out in a car for the "gold diggers" of the Hudson Bay country. All went well until they reached Valdez in Northern Ontario. There the highway ended and the boys took their dunnage aboard a small tug and steamed away down the great Porcupine river headed towards Hudson Bay and the last "jumping off place." They had planned to spend the summer in the big woods, leisurely acquainting themselves with the surroundings, prospecting a little for gold and other minerals and laying the groundwork for a winter of trapping.

The Manchester boys spent several months in the Hudson Bay country, found it not to their liking, and after they had absorbed all of the frontier atmosphere that the near-Arctic had to offer they started back to civilization again, feeling the urge to go farther west where they might go still farther north. An unfortunate smash-up of their car in Detroit put Olander in the hospital for several days, but that did not long interfere with their plans to head north to Alaska. They reached California early in May of 1937 and from Los Angeles they were given a lift by a friend to Seattle. At this point they made up their minds that they were going to rough it for at least a year, so they shipped out on the steamer North Sea for Ketchikan, Alaska. "Upon their arrival in Ketchikan Service. This gave the boys an opportunity to do some prospecting on the side and although they were in territory which was sealing and very, due to the precipitous mountains that sloped down to the narrow beach line, they nevertheless picked up plenty of pointers about Alaskan "meat dough" here that came in handy many times later.

Worked in Forests. All summer long of 1937 they worked in the forestry project with now and then a forage into the interior for a round at prospecting. On one of these trips they went through a country about 50 miles east and inland from Ketchikan, where plenty of game abounded, and then they decided that hunting and trapping was to be their vocation for the winter. They grubstaked in Ketchikan, started off through the maze of islands that lined the coast, headed for a winter in the Alaskan hinterlands. And what a winter it was for them.

Enough returns to the salt water and goose—no one knows where—only to return at adult life to follow the age-old procedure—spaw and die. It is all very mysterious and not even the old timers on the coast nor the Indians can explain it satisfactorily.

High Living Costs During his stay on the coast Olander and Haar helped catch and sell 200,000 pounds of salmon and when the run was over they had a neat sum as their share of the work—and real work it was. Everything was double and triple the cost in Alaska and in certain cities and towns there are no pennies, nickels or dimes, Olander said. It was "two bits" or nothing—no change. Incidentally, it was in Alaska, Olander said, that the term "two bits" was born. Mining in the Yukon and other interior districts has nothing but their gold pokes and they make over two pinches of "dust" or small fragments of gold per drink. Thus "two bits" was born, also "four bits," "six bits" and "a buck." Like Mexico and other Latin American countries, the old "cartwheel" or silver dollar is standard coin.

Back Only a Week all that was left of theirarder. Once during the winter an act of nature cut Olander one of his feet. He fell into a snow hole in the bay ice and before he got back camp, an estimated seven miles, his whole foot beyond his ankle had been frozen. They both worked the leg for several days and finally circulation was restored although the leg was still in his foot. "It was a close call," Olander said. "At one time we were afraid we would have to turn doctor and amputate it."

Habitat Fishing Further adventure awaited the Manchester boys in the habitat and salmon fishing along the coast from the Ketchikan base of the company operating in the area. Olander tells of his greatest thrill on a habitat boat, working in the bitterest weather along the rails of the small but seaworthy boats, with their lives in their hands every moment of stormy weather. Many times are lost each year off the Alaskan coast from these habitat boats, Olander stated, and the industry is regarded as one of the most dangerous in Alaska.
