Paris, Dec. 6 -(AP) - France and Germany today signed an accord, widely termed a "war renunciation pact," which pledged them to amicable discussion of diffi-culties instead of resorting to arm-The agreement declared the two governments recognized as definite the present boundaries between them and that no French-German territorial question exists.

It said the governments were convinced "pacific relations and good neighborliness" between them constitute an essential element of "consolidation of the European situation" and the maintenance of general peace.
