## BROKER REPORTED ALL COMMISSIONS RECEIVED BY HIM

### Silberman Asserts Income Tax Returns Show He Received Entire Amount Although Kemp Given Share

Bridgeport, Dec. 9.—(AP)—Samuel H. Silberman told a Superior court jury today that although he shared Merritt Parkway commissions with O. Leroy Kemp, former state land purchasing agent, he received the entire amount of the thirty-seven transactions in which he is accused of unlawfully sharing with Kemp about \$20,000 in commissions from clients whose land was taken for the right of way of the \$25,000,000 super-highway. In each of these deals in which he testified he received the entire amount, usually "half" in cash.

No record of payments. Silberman said, however, he had no record of these payments. The witness, at times appearing reluctant to answer the questions of Prosecutor Lewis W. Willis, asserted he had assured Kemp that he had received the full amount of the commissions in his income tax returns and also told the former state land agent he would testify before grand jury that he had received the entire amount.

## Figures in Trial

Ruth Eiting  
Los Angeles, Dec. 9.—(AP)—Attorneys stressed the daughter-against-father angle of the Martin Snyder attempted murder trial today, as questioning of prospective jury members proceeded with indications that testimony-taking would begin before the day ended.

Snyder, "Colonel Gimp" to his friends, is accused of attempting to kill his daughter, Edith, 21; his former wife, Ruth Eiting, the blue singer; and Myrtle Alderman, Miss Eiting's pianist, in Alderman's Hollywood Hills home last Oct. 15. Alderman was wounded in the abdomen, but Miss Eiting and Snyder escaped injury. Snyder also is charged with kidnaping the trio in violation of state gun laws by carrying a pistol with the serial numbers obliterated.

Concentrates on Alibi. Jerry Greer, head of the defense staff, concentrated on the father-daughter angle in his questioning of venire members. Six men and six women were in the jury box, but all were subject to challenges from either prosecution or defense. Under California law, a jury is accepted as a whole, not individually.

"You would not be influenced, would you?" Greer asked, "by testimony that a man attempted to murder his own daughter—if you were convinced the facts are not strictly as the prosecution pictures them?"

U. S. Black, deputy district attorney, indicated he regarded Miss Snyder, secretary to Miss Eiting and daughter of Snyder by a previous marriage, as a highly important state witness.

## CRASH DURING FOG CAUSES 2 DEATHS

### Man And Woman Suffer Fractured Skulls; Three Wesleyan Students Hurt.

East Hampton, Dec. 9.—(AP)—A man and woman were injured fatally and three Wesleyan students injured seriously early today when two automobiles collided in the fog on the Middletown highway here.

Miss Barbara Watrous, 25, a telephone operator, was killed instantly, while the driver of the car in which she was a passenger, Albert Brown, 32, of Portland, died in Middletown hospital, Middletown, two days after the accident. Both suffered fractured skulls.

The injured students were Paul F. Schabed, 19, of Hollis, I. I., driver of the other car; Frank Putnam, 21, of New Britain; and Joseph Stone, 21, of Harrisburg, Pa. All were taken to Middletown hospital where their injuries were listed as possible skull fractures and lacerations.

## CHINESE FORCES ROUT JAPANESE

### Cross Siao River To Defeat Invading Army After Three-Hour Engagement

Shanghai, Dec. 9.—(AP)—Chinese forces which have been blocking the Japanese advance toward the Siao river for several months were reported to have crossed the Siao river today and routed the Japanese at Yungui after a three-hour engagement.

Yungui is on the Kiangsi-Nanchang railway 30 miles north of Nanchang. Important Chinese air base and capital of Kiangsi province are located here.

The Chinese have fought the invaders stubbornly every mile down the railway since the occupation of Kiangsi July 26, with the result that the Japanese have advanced only 50 miles in 135 days of fighting.

Westward Drive Bogs Down. The Chinese also reported the Japanese drive westward from Hankow had bogged down along a zig-zag line through Tsoochin, 50 miles to the west.

Chinese military advisers from Chungking, the temporary capital, reported major fighting in South China near Tsungku, 25 miles northeast of Canton.

These advisers also said Japanese warships were shelling villages on the coast, opposite the island of Hainan, apparently in preparation for an attempted landing.

Severe fighting was reported in the Kongmoo sector, 55 miles south of Canton, where the famed 15th Route army commander, Gen. T'ai Ting-kai, was fighting the Chinese. Kill 700 Japanese.

## JAPAN ASSERTS POLICY CHANGE ON 'OPEN DOOR'

### Foreign Minister Informs United States And British Ambassadors Old Principle Has Vanished.

Tokyo, Dec. 9.—(AP)—A source close to the government said today that Foreign Minister Hirota Artia had informed the United States and Great Britain the principle of the "open door" in China had vanished.

The minister was said to have spoken fully and frankly yesterday to United States Ambassador Joseph C. Grew and British Ambassador Robert Llewellyn Craig, leaving no doubt as to Japan's position.

The informant said his conversation contained such phraseology as "Hirota's attitude is a complete reversal of the old principle" and "you will not be permitted" referring to conditions under which foreign commerce may continue in China.

Lays Down General Principles. It was said, but Artia laid down two general principles regarding Japan's line of policy. Specific questions will be answered according to the following principles:

"The Chinese-Japanese conflict in China has changed the political situation and has virtually eliminated the power pact, which among other things provided equal opportunity for all powers.

## INDICATE ITALIANS WILL AID REBELS

### Insurgent Sources Assert French Have No Cause For Fear About Frontier.

Hendaye, France (At the Spanish Frontier) Dec. 9.—(AP)—Insurgent sources indicated today that a movement of Italian troops to a point just south of the French-Spanish border was a part of preparations for an offensive against Catalonia.

Without confirming border reports that 10,000 Italians were concentrated at Logrono shortly after the French had no cause for alarm.

Although the insurgent border remained tightly closed, reports drifted in through the Pyrenees that Generalissimo Franco's offensive awaited completion of naval preparations.

Believe Bombardments Planned. This report led insurgent sources to believe that Franco's offensive would be a major one, and to predict that General Franco planned to subject Catalan coastal ports to heavy sea and air bombardment.

The main target for such bombardment, insurgents said, would be Tortosa in southernmost Catalonia territory. Tortosa was a base for the Ebro river last spring.

If Tortosa were conquered, they declared, it would be a natural route to open northward along the right bank of the Ebro deep into government territory.

## UKRAINIANS PRESS AUTONOMY CLAIM

### 15 Deputies Present Demand In Form Of Bill Before Parliament Of Poland.

Warsaw, Dec. 9.—(AP)—Poland's Ukrainians presented a claim to the speaker of the Sejm (Parliament) today for territorial autonomy in the eastern part of the country, including the regions of Volynia and Halicz, nearly 50,000 square miles in area and with a population of 8,000,000.

The question of self-government was being agitated by Ukrainians in Poland the past 16 years but this was the first time a concrete proposal was presented. The demand, in the form of a bill to be put before the Sejm, was signed by 15 Ukrainians.

## Boy Accidentally Stabbed Lives With Stitched Heart

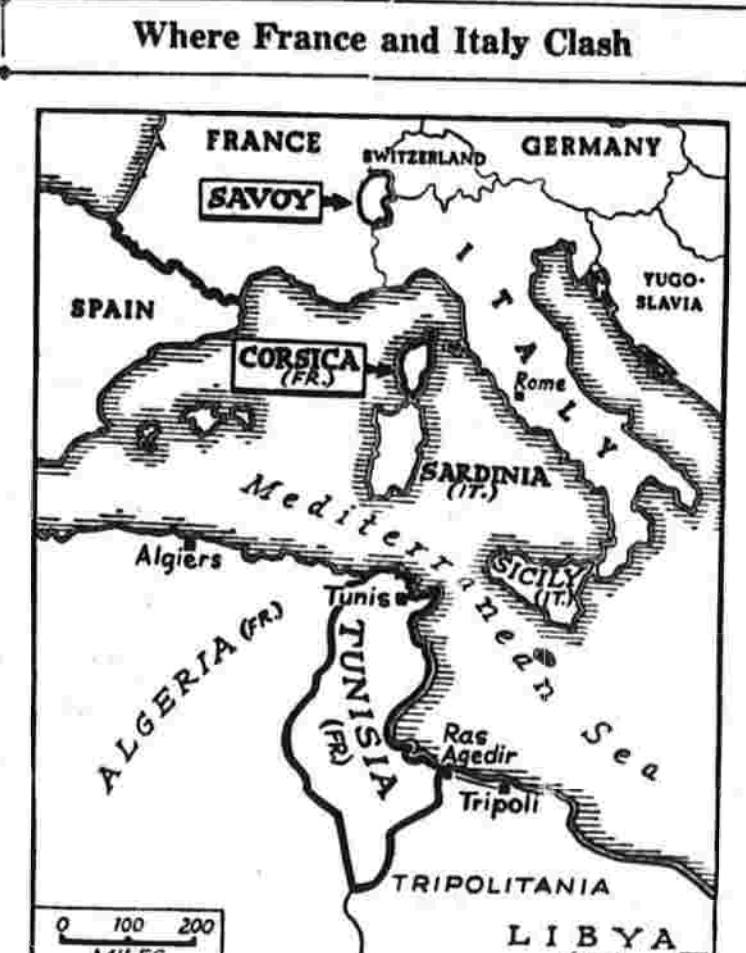
Philadelphia, Dec. 9.—(AP)—A 14-year-old boy, stabbed accidentally in a tussle with a classmate today with three stitches in his heart.

Dr. Bruce Fleming, chief surgeon of Roanoke Memorial hospital, performed the delicate operation an hour and a half after the mishap. He shipped away some of the rib bone and found what had kept the boy, Adam Ertmer, alive.

He was filled with about a pint of blood. From the wounded auricle wall, leading slowly from the sac, the blood seeped out. The heart was arrested, and reducing hemorrhage.

The blood was drained off, the puncture stitched and the blood later injected into the boy's veins.

### U. S. SEEKS TRADE BONDS AT PARLEY

**Sent Threat Note**

Washington — A Pan-American conference of commerce and culture is in the making.

Delegates from 21 nations, representing more than a quarter of a billion people, are forging the framework of a Pan-American conference opening at Lima, Peru, today. How strong the framework will remain to be seen. But aside from promoting the Pan-American highway and providing for exchanges of professors and students, delegates hope to promote the general understanding of the masses on the sister continents.

Speaking generally (because there have been some warnings that Argentina for one will burn its European bridges) their aim is American solidarity. Their work as a part of America's answer to the insinuation of totalitarianism and propaganda in the last few years.

The rest of the answer is the exchange of military and naval news among the powers of two continents, and Uncle Sam's most ambitious peacetime military and naval program.

After the old world's Munich conference remade the map of Europe, France and England hoped for military strength to make Uncle Sam the actual as well as theoretical police of the new world. Previously, he had assumed Canada the role of the United States would stand idly by if Canada should be attacked.

This program and these sentiments should not be universal approval. In the United States certain peace advocates and others have denounced such an excuse for building up armaments beyond reason. In South America warnings still are sounded against the designs of the Yankee.

Commissions At Work

But American naval and military men are talking about a Pan-American conference on military and naval activities in South America. The United States is about to send a naval and military mission to Colombia, whose boundaries are close to our vital Panama Canal.

Already we have a naval mission of four to five ships, four naval advisers and eight army men in Latin America. We also have close to \$2,000,000,000 in bond holdings—greater than our investments elsewhere in the world.

Wetters has just hinted we may expand our military in South America. He didn't say what these missions would do, but it is assumed they would try to integrate the military and naval units of various South American nations.

Plans At Lima

The Pan American conference opens today.

Most important, a total of more than a million and a half tons of naval armaments—the combined fleets of the United States and her southern neighbors—are available for common continental defense.

That's more than England's boats, and 1,000,000 tons of it is Uncle Sam's own.

Also, under a program recently extended to President Roosevelt, the United States will contribute to the Americas closer together. Educational, financial and road building work would be included.

Why all this activity?

There are indications that Italy, Japan, and especially Germany are making a drive to make inroads in Latin America. The American for Americans' advocates seem the excesses committed by Germany in Europe, and Germany operates nearly 4,000 mines of commercial aviation between Europe and South America. The regular air lines could be converted to military use in time of need. Aside from the United States, France, with about 3,000 miles of air lines, is the only other air power on the scene in Latin America.

Active Naval Work Reported

Nations are financing "shirt" societies all over both continents, and with the Japanese, buying vital oil at bargain prices from Mexico.

In Essen, Germany, says Dr. David E. Brown, a New England, engineer, a special Nazi organization devoted to clandestine traffic in armaments in Latin America.

There is an Italian-controlled factory of Caproni airplanes in the vicinity of Lima, Peru.

Officials of the Italian Navy are constructing peruvian police force.

There are Nazi ships of the Argentine, Brazil and Uruguay.

Nazi Germany is giving away hundreds of radio sets to Latin America which can receive news from Germany.

Whether or not this information is accurate much of it must have reached Uncle Sam's political and military leaders, for they are boosting estimates of our regular army strength from 160,000 to 400,000 men.

New Panama Defense

Secretary of War Harry Woodring has just reported in detail that the Panama Canal defenses are vulnerable, especially from the air, and must be made impregnable.

Such high posts mean the struggle for the influence in South America is on.

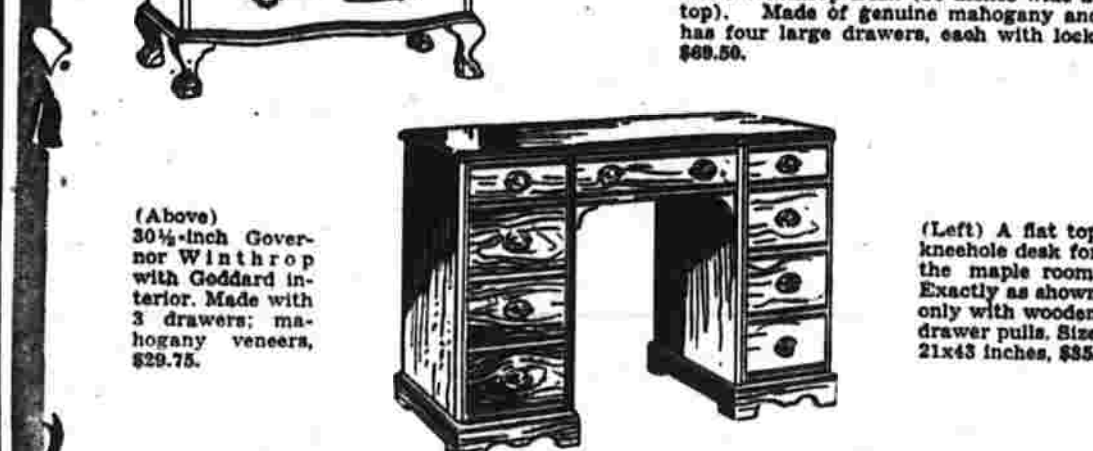
