## RULES STATE MUST GIVE NEGRO EQUAL EDUCATION RIGHTS

### Supreme Court Gives Opinion In Ruling That University Of Missouri Must Admit St. Louis Student.

Washington, Dec. 12.—(AP)—The Supreme Court ruled today that a state must give "equality" in educational privileges to white and Negro law students.

It gave this opinion in holding that the University of Missouri Law School must admit Lloyd L. Gaines, St. Louis Negro, as a student.

Chief Justice Hughes delivered the majority opinion that held Missouri in compelling Negro law students to attend school outside the state had violated the "equal rights" provision of the constitution.

Missouri provided that until a law school for Negroes was developed in the state the tuition of Negro law students should be paid at universities in adjacent states.

The question here, Chief Justice Hughes said, is not of a duty of the state to supply legal training, or of the quality of the training which it does supply, but of its duty when it provides such training to furnish it to the residents of the state upon the basis of an equality of right.

Privileges Denied Negroes  
By the operation of the laws of Missouri a privilege has been created for white law students which is denied to Negroes by reason of their race.

"The white resident is afforded legal education within the state; the Negro resident having the same qualifications is refused it thereby must go outside the state to obtain it."

That is a denial of the equality of legal right to the enjoyment of legal privileges which the state has set up, and the provision for the payment of tuition fees in another state does not remove the discrimination.

The chief justice's opinion reversed a decision by the Missouri Supreme court in 1935, which held that the state of Missouri arrived at a "reasonable" conclusion in its judgment should be affirmed.

Chief Justice Hughes said with Butler's concurrence, "we understand the grave difficulties of the situation and refused to upset the settled procedure, or use a 'stream bed' method, suitable only for the production of certain limited articles."

## HARTFORD MAN ASSERTS FIRM HAS MONOPOLY

### Justice Department Presents Evidence Two Companies Exercise Indirect Control Of Glass Containers.

Washington, Dec. 12.—(AP)—The Justice Department presented evidence today that two companies exercise indirect control over 95 per cent of the nation's glass container production.

These companies were identified by F. G. Smith, president of the Hartford Empire Glass Company, Hartford, Conn., as being the Owens-Illinois Glass Company, Chicago, Ill., and the Federal Glass Container Company, Chicago, Ill.

At the same time Hugh Con. Justice Department attorney conducted the hearing, brought out that the Owens-Illinois Company had no licensed outside concern to use its process since 1914, that any one desiring now to go into the glass industry and compete with established manufacturers would have to apply for a patent license to manufacture, or use a "stream bed" method, suitable only for the production of certain limited articles.

## OFFERS TO ASK STOCKHOLDERS APPROVE PLAN

### Willkie Would Submit Proposal That Fair Purchase Price For Electric Company Fixed By Arbitration

Washington, Dec. 12.—(AP)—Wendell Willkie, president of Commonwealth and Southern Corporation, offered today to submit to stockholders his proposal that a fair purchase price for the Tennessee Electric Power Company be fixed by arbitration.

In a letter to David E. Lilienthal, director of the Tennessee Valley Authority, Willkie said he was making this suggestion because "in proper manufacture, Connecticut ranks first with 52¢ per kilowatt hour, while Tennessee ranks last with 11¢ per kilowatt hour."

Willkie suggested some time ago that the Securities and Exchange Commission be named to fix a fair purchase price for the Tennessee Electric Power Company's properties. The company's stock is now trading at 11¢ per share.

### GAYDA ASSERTS ITALIANS' NEED OF SOMALILAND

Rome, Dec. 12.—(AP)—Italy's need of French Somaliland for the development of Ethiopia was declared today by Virgilio Gayda, the Fascist editor who often expresses Premier Mussolini's views.

Gayda, who previously had aired Italy's alleged grievances against France in Tunisia and her desire for lower tolls and a share in control of the Suez canal, charged the French with hindering Italian colonial interests through possession of Djibouti.

The port of French Somaliland is the terminus of the railway linking Addis Ababa, capital of Ethiopia, with the Red Sea.
