The area is important as a source of hydro-electric power for Barcelona, chief city of government Spain and center of its war industries.

At the same time Insurgent infantry opened an offensive in the far western part of Spain near Valsequillo, about 30 miles west of Pozoblanco.

CZECH PARLIAMENT DELEGATES AUTHORITY

Prague, Dec. 15—(AP) — The Czechoslovak Parliament last night delegated a wide measure of constitutional authority to the government, under the newly established two-party system with one party as the "friendly opposition."

An empowering bill, suhmitted to Parliament by the new government of Premier Rudolf Beran, was adopted 148 to 16. It permits the cabinet to issue decrees, provided a minister from each of the autonomous regimes, Slovakia and Carpatho-Ukrainia, attends the session. The act was interpreted, however to limit the government to not more than one change of the constitution by degree; other alterations would require Parliamentary consent.


