KEMP TRIAL JURY LISTENS TO PLEAS; WILL HEAR JUDGE

McEvoy Scheduled To Deliver Charge Before Jurors Retire To Deliberate On Fate Of State Land Agent

Bridgeport, Dec. 16—(AP)—Defense Counsel John Keogh, summing up in the conspiracy trial of George Kemp, emphasized to the jury today that the former state land agent's work made possible construction of the Merritt Parkway and expressed the hope that he would not receive a "token sentence" as his reward.

The summation was completed simultaneously with the start of the mid-morning recess. With the jury's return to the courtroom, State Attorney Lorin W. Willis began the prosecution's final demand for a conviction.

The jury reconvened at 1:45 p.m. to hear Judge Frank P. McEvoy's charge before they retire to deliberate his fate.

After the jury had filed out for a luncheon recess at the close of 30 minutes of final arguments for the state, John Keogh, counsel for Kemp, arose to object to portions of the summation given by State Attorney Lorin W. Willis on the grounds that they were not based on evidence presented in the court.

McEvoy deferred decision on the objection until after the recess.

Willis, who started his final summation at 11:45 a.m., declared that the evidence heard spelled "one thing and one name—conspiracy."

Reviewing the testimony of Thomas H. Cooke and Silberman, land agents indicted with Kemp, and charges of conspiracy between them and Kemp, the state attorney declared "conspiracy understood" and "is declared."

CHRISTMAS VACATION EARLY; PAY LACKING

Bridgeport, Dec. 16—(AP)—Christmas vacation began a week earlier than usual today as schools were closed for lack of money to pay teachers. The instructors received two days' salary yesterday, their first pay since Nov. 30.

TENSION RISES BETWEEN U. S. AND GERMANY

Hints Retaliatory Measures May Be Invoked If American Property Rights In Reich Jeopardized More.

Washington, Dec. 16—(AP)—Diplomatic tension between United States and Germany mounted today with hints that retaliatory measures might be invoked if American property rights in the Reich are jeopardized further by anti-Jewish and other discriminatory decrees.

This possibility came to light as the United States renewed its seven-month-old quest for adequate written assurances from Germany that American citizens will not be their race or creed. The request was drawn up in connection with the rights of the rights of both Catholics and Jews.

Meanwhile, Joseph P. Kennedy, ambassador to London, arrived in the United States to confer with President Roosevelt. He expressed himself in New York yesterday as being "not optimistic" regarding the outlook for peace in Europe.

Kennedy left at once for Washington to report to the general European situation. All other American envoys, Kennedy has taken an active part in seeking aid for Jewish refugees from Germany.

Went's Role Outlined
Sumner Welles, acting secretary of state, in making public the Berlin note delivered this week in Berlin, refused to rule out the question of retaliation, which might arise both in the Jewish connection and in the Austrian debt situation, among the two countries.

State Department officials made no secret of the fact that Germany's long delays in answering American inquiries were both unsatisfactory and unusual.

RIGHTS RETURN OPENS DISPUTE ON MONARCHY

Decision Of Franco On Alfonso Divides Insurgent Opinion On Imminence Of King Being Put On Throne

Hendaye, France (At the Spanish Frontier), Dec. 16—(AP)—The decision of the Spanish insurgent generalissimo, Francisco Franco, to restore all civil rights and property to former King Alfonso sharply divided insurgent opinion today on the imminence of a return to the monarchy.

The decree giving Alfonso "all rights that correspond to him as a citizen of Spain" was read by Franco to the insurgent Council of Ministers at Burgos, and they adopted it yesterday.

One group of insurgents at this border zone said it was the first step toward restoring the Bourbon monarchy in Spain, backed by Franco. (Spanish circles in Rome, where Alfonso is living, doubted he would return soon to Spain as a result of the decree.)

Another group, however, declared that Franco took only a temporary step to still growing fears among Carlists, a separate monarchical group, that the insurgent king had no intention of putting a king back on the throne.

Credence given reports that Alfonso left the throne April 14, 1931, during a bloodless revolt which brought about the Spanish republic (now represented by the Barcelona government) against which the Franco insurgents are warring.

It was reported a year ago that Franco might agree to Prince Juan, Alfonso's third son, as king of insurgent held territory.

Most of the Bourbon and Carlist monarchist leaders were said to have agreed early in the war that Alfonso would be acceptable to them. The blue-shirted Falangists, an important element of the insurgent army, were said to be opposed.

COSTER'S NAME COMES INTO WATERBURY TRIAL

Venireman, Under Examination, Employed As Custodian Of Drug Firm's Building In New Haven.

Waterbury, Dec. 16—(AP)—The name of F. Donald Coster, indicted president of McKesson & Robbins, Inc., was injected into the trial of the Waterbury municipal fraud case today when a venireman under examination as the long task of picking a jury looked forward to being employed as a custodian of McKesson & Robbins buildings in New Haven.

James D. C. Murray, counsel for Lind, Geo. Frank Hayes who is one of 22 on trial on charges of conspiracy to defraud the city, then asked the prospective juror, Lewis S. Doolittle of North Haven:

"Do you know Mr. Coster?"

"No, I wouldn't know him if I saw him," Doolittle replied.

Special Prosecutor Hugh M. A. Interpooled with a smile, "I don't know who you needed a custodian," and Murray asked further:

"You at least have some merchandise where you are?"

"Plenty," said Doolittle.

Coster was indicted on a conspiracy count in New York yesterday after an investigation disclosed that he had received \$10,000,000 in an apparent loan of \$10,000,000 from McKesson & Robbins assets.

Excused On Mutual Request
Judge Ernest A. Inglis excused Doolittle on the mutual request of state and defense.

BRITAIN MAKES PLANS TO AID IN TRADE WAR

Lays Groundwork To Help Exporters Meet Nazis' Barter Trade System By Increasing Guarantees.

London, Dec. 16—(AP)—Great Britain laid the groundwork today for a trade war—if necessary—against the totalitarian states.

Backed by Prime Minister Chamberlain's new forceful attitude toward Nazi Germany, the Export Guarantees Bill, seen as a possible step to British export meeting Germany's barter trade system, was given second reading by the House of Commons.

The measure would increase from \$50,000,000 (\$25,000,000) the total export guarantees which the Board of Trade could grant to exporters as a provision whereby material assistance could be sent to China.

R. S. Hudson, secretary of the Overseas Trade Department, described the bill as one of the methods "without precedent in our history" which Great Britain might be required to use in fighting "unfair foreign competition."

Avoid Reference to Germany
Members of Parliament carefully avoided direct reference to Germany, whose political leaders were warned by Chamberlain yesterday to beware of Britain's financial power in any war.

Hudson linked the export drive with rearmament when he declared that when a very large extent is dependent on the question of whether or not the world believes we are earnest about our schemes of rearmament.

Lady Astor Sorry U. S. Not in Empire

Indicted President Of McKesson And Robbins Drug Corporation, Disclosed As Ex-Convict, Presses Pistol To Right Ear And Pulls Trigger.

Fairfield, Dec. 16—(AP)—F. Donald Coster, indicted president of the vast McKesson and Robbins Drug Corporation who had been disclosed as an ex-convict with a criminal record going back more than a quarter of a century, shot and killed himself today at his country mansion near here.

Federal authorities were on the way to the luxurious Coster home to arrest him at the time.

Fully dressed, Coster went into the bathroom, pressed a pistol to his right ear, and pulled the trigger. First reports indicated that Mrs. Coster had seen her husband with the pistol but had been powerless to restrain him. She collapsed afterward.

Samuel Rich, an attorney rushed from the home as soon as he had heard what had happened, put his hand to his head, pointing with a finger as though it were a pistol, and shouted:

"He shot himself! He shot himself!"

Several Three Fists
Investigators were told that three weeks ago Coster—formerly Philip Munkin, an ex-convict until he made an almost incredible change in his name, his associations and his whole life—had indicated an intention to take his own life and that his three pistols had been secreted in the family garage by a chauffeur.

The investigation into the \$57,000,000 drug firm which Coster headed had not begun at that time. Investigation of an apparent \$10,000,000 overstatement of assets at the front door of the Coster home only to hear the shot that ended Coster's life.

HOPEKINS LEADING FOR ROPER POST

Receives Most Frequent Mention As Successor To Secretary Of Commerce.

Washington, Dec. 16—(AP)—Harry Hopkins, WPA administrator and an intimate presidential advisor, received most frequent mention today in capital discussion of a successor to Secretary of Commerce Daniel Roper.

In accepting the resignation of the conservative, 71-year old Roper, President Roosevelt gave no indication of his choice for the post.

There have been rumors for several weeks that still other members of the president's official family might retire or be shifted to other positions. Postmaster General, Secretary of War Woodring and Secretary Swanson of the Navy have been mentioned in that connection.

Reports that Hopkins was current event while the latter was denying he would withdraw. Hopkins has been mentioned in connection with his capacity as relief director, and is one of the most regular White House conferees.

If he is appointed, one Democratic member who asked anonymously declared it would be a "bold" up for the 1940 Democratic presidential nomination.

Others Mentioned For Post
Hopkins was not the only person whose name figured in capital speculation yesterday at the Commerce secretaryship. Among those mentioned were Richard C. Patterson, former radio executive who recently came as assistant secretary to the Federal Reserve Board, and Ernest G. Draper, former assistant secretary who now is in the Federal Reserve Board and its forerunner, the Federal Reserve Bank.

The type of man the president would want for the post was not clear.

Wanted Drug Case In Conn. District
Hartford, Dec. 16—(AP)—The sensational McKesson & Robbins case lobbied up here again today with a double-barreled attempt to bring reorganization proceedings into jurisdiction of Connecticut.

Two separate involuntary petitions for reorganization under the Bankruptcy Act were filed within a few hours of each other in the Federal district court, by groups of creditors and bondholders respectively.

No date for hearing was asked for, pending the disposition of the jurisdiction question in a similar petition already on file in the southern district of New York.

Late yesterday at the Federal court clerk's office in New Haven the first of the two Connecticut petitions was filed, by three creditors, alleging claims totaling \$200,000 against the \$10,000,000 drug firm of McKesson & Robbins of Bridgeport. They are the Bankers Trust Co., Waterbury, Munson D. Shaw Co.,

TWO INSTANTLY KILLED IN CRASH

Mangled Almost Beyond Identify When Auto Rams Into Rear Of Truck.

Wallingford, Dec. 16.—(AP)—Two men were killed instantly today when their automobile crashed into the rear of a truck on the Meriden highway here.

The dead were identified as Nin J. Boncourt of New Haven and Charles W. Arva of West Haven.

A third man in the machine, Frank Perrotti, Jr., 26, of Woodbridge, was critically injured and was taken to Meriden hospital.

The two dead men were mangled almost beyond identify and police were unable to learn who they were until almost two hours after the accident occurred.

Leut. Richard Barry of the Wallingford police whose men were still investigating the crash early today said he believed Perrotti was driving the automobile. The truck was operated by William J. Anderson, 41, of Water, Conn.

All Three Hurtled Out

The truck was proceeding south on the highway, Barry said, when the automobile, traveling at a high rate of speed, crunched into the rear of the truck. The three men were hurled out.

Perrotti suffered a possible fractured skull and other injuries and was taken to Meriden hospital where his name was placed on the danger list. He was unconscious when admitted to the hospital.

The automobile was almost completely demolished, so great was the impact, and the debris blocked traffic on the highway for a considerable period.

ITALIAN JEWS ORDERED TO EXCHANGE HOLDINGS

Rome, Dec. 16.—(AP)—The Italian Cabinet today ordered Jews to exchange all their land and buildings exceeding a fixed value for bonds bearing four per cent interest.

The order, carried out provisionally since adopted Nov. 10, forcing Jews to own land with a taxable income exceeding 8,000 lire (about \$260) a year and buildings whose taxable income exceeds 20,000 lire (about \$1,040).

A government corporation will be created to take over Jewish property and operate it pending re-sale on conditions permit.

STRIKE HEAD JAILED

Valenciennes, France, Dec. 16.—(AP)—Julio Bousinault, northern metal workers union representative who gave the order Nov. 27 when started a stay-in strike of more than 25,000 workers, was sentenced today to a month in jail for labor agitation.

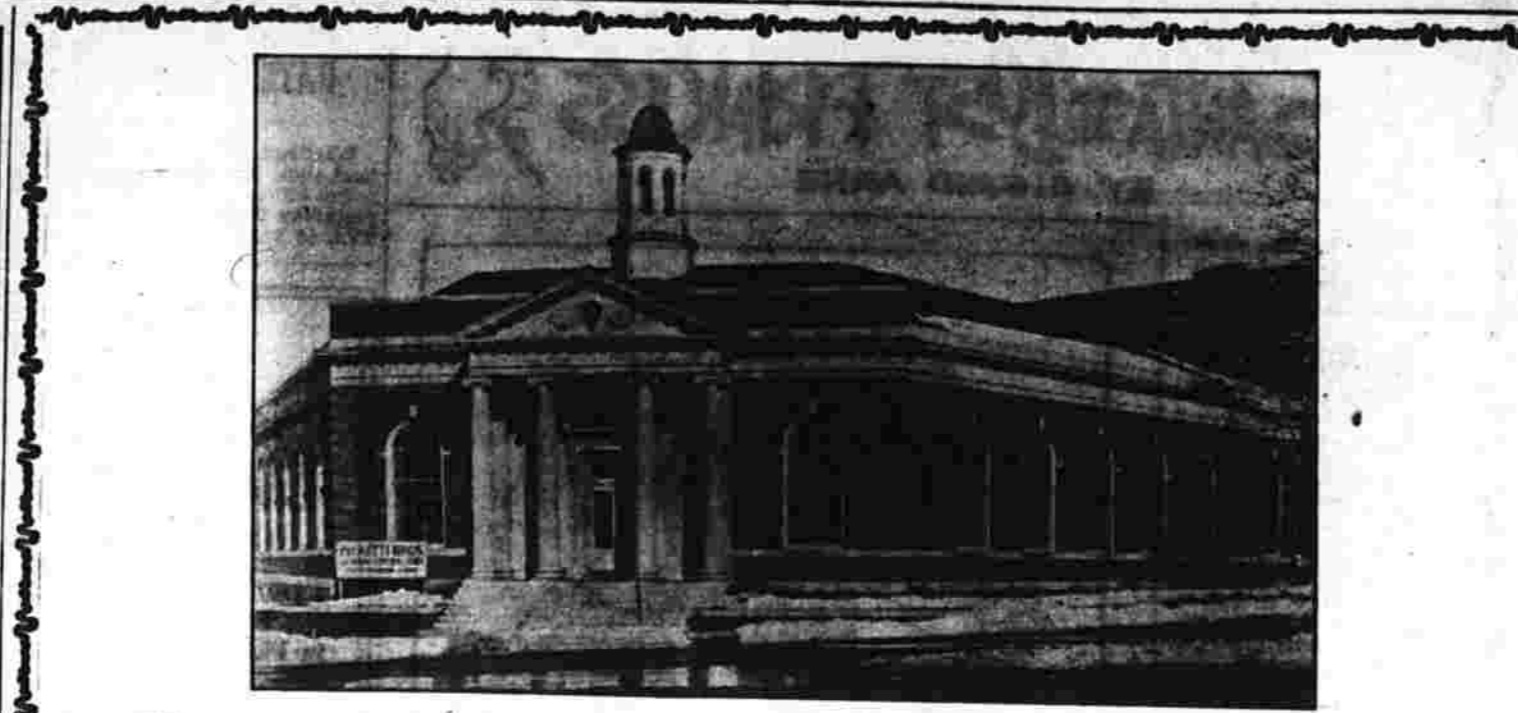
