SOCIAL SECURITY CHANGES ADVISED

Advisory Council Of Board Advocates Broad Extension Of Old Age Insurance

Washington, Dec. 19.—(AP)—The Social Security Board was described by officials today as ready to parallel at least in fundamentals the recommendations of its Advisory Council for broad extension of the Federal old age insurance system.

The board will submit to President Roosevelt next month a detailed program for expansion of the Social Security Act. Its details have not been disclosed.

The Advisory Council proposed last night that insurance coverage be extended by 1940 to about 6,000,000 workers now excluded and a portion of our generally employed population, including business and professional men, farmers and mechanics.

Advocating the principle of "family protection for the family unit," it proposed benefits for widows and children of insured workers deprived of their earning power by retirement.

With these expansion proposals the council made a third major recommendation that present plans for a \$7,000,000,000 old age insurance fund be scrapped in favor of a trust and insured by Social Security. All revenue from Social Security would go to that trust.

Each would pay Third Under the plan the government would pay one-third of the cost of the old age insurance program. One-third would come from the payroll tax on employees and one-third from the payroll tax on employers.

This tax, now one per cent each on employees and employers, is scheduled to go up to 3 1/2 per cent in 1940.

Other recommendations of the council provided for increasing the schedule of benefits to be paid in early years above the present estimated average of \$19 a month; for changing the date of beginning payments from 1942 to 1940; and eventually for paying single beneficiaries less than married persons in order to help bear the cost of setting up family protection.
