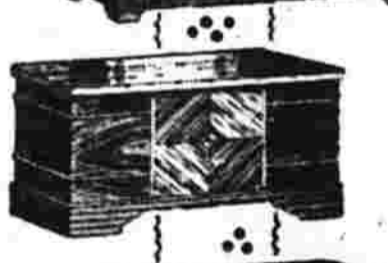

Why the Board of Electionists, when considering that suggestion that the registrars of voters be required to record the address of each voter on the voting list, did not go straight ahead and do something about it is not easy to explain.

Nothing could be more self-evident than that in a place where the ancient system of merely placing the names on the voting list, with good enough care as to minimize so small that there is not more than one voter of any particular name, is inefficient and provocative of error or even fraud.

With several voters of the same surname and given name appearing on the list, the election day checkers have a harder time of identifying them separately than the celebrated identification of Eugene Tawney and Mortimer Lightfoot by Roger Alderbrook and other gentlemen and "other gentlemen."

There are many names on the Manchester voting list which duplicate the names of other persons—some cases a number of times. Address books and directories provide a perfect means of identification, and when an elector of a certain name living at a certain number on a certain street is identified and his name has been checked, no one else can vote on that day under that name and address.

Since the names of the ten persons of the same name on the list, with no addresses, even though nine voters have been checked, there is no way at all of knowing, from the record, which one of the ten has not yet appeared and any other person of that name could vote again if so disposed, and get away with it unless some checker happens to remember the name.
