

There were general expressions of approval in the Senate at Mr. Roosevelt's selection of Col. F. C. Harrington to succeed Hopkins as WP& administrator. The Senate will not act on Harrington's appointment, because he will remain on the Army payroll and will be designated "actpayroll and will be designated "act One pro-administration Senator, J. Hamilton Lewis (D-III), said Mr. Receivelt's appointment of Hopkins indicated that the latter was being groomed for the presidency.

"The president", Lewis asserted, "can't be blind to the fact that Hoover got the presidency first by being secretary of commerce."

"Shortly I shall go to the big boss (the president) and make bold to ask whether he wishes by this appointment to direct me to abandon Roosevelt for a third term and accept Hopkins for a first term."

cept Hopkins for a first term." Changes in Relief Seen

There was some speculation that Hopkins elevation to the cabinet had cleared the way for funda-mental changes in New Deal relief Many students of government af-fairs believe that the end of WPA as it has been operated since its crea-tion in 1935 is at hand. They look for Congress to put restrictive laws about it and the administration it-self to place less emphasis upon the WPA method of meeting depression needs. needs.

Instead, they forecast greater emphasis upon such undertakings as social security with its unemployment insurance program and upon restoration of private employment.

Also, if the clamor over WPA in Congress produces results in proportion to criticism, the trend next session will be to shift more of the research burden back to the states and take away from the administra-tion a free hand in distributing whatever relief funds Congress does

whatever relief funds Congress does approve.

At the same time, Congress is expected to write into law rigid restrictions against WPA political activity.

Escalground Entirely Different.
Harrington has a background entirely different from that of Hopkins, under whom he has served since 1935 as an assistant administrator in charge of the works program. Hopkins came to Washington in 1933 with a long record of welfare and social work. He had served as New York state welfare director when Franklin Roosevelt was governor. was governor.

Harrington was assigned to the WPA by the War Department. A West Point graduate, his entire career has been in the army. Immediately before taking over his






