Beautiful Birds Sing

SCIENTISTS, returning from exploration in the wilds of New Guinea, invariably agree that the bird of paradise is the most beautiful in the world.

At mating time, the bird of paradise shows its greatest show, a riot of color to old technical color. But it is a highly scientific show and has rarely been photographed and only with great success.

For the birds are found only in the depths of the New Guinea jungles. They are difficult to approach. When mating, as many as 30 males will gather for a "battle" or dancing party. It begins with a great quivering of wings and loud cries. Then the wings are suddenly raised to a gorgeous cascade over the body. The bird holds this splendid position for 30 seconds.

Next, each bird leaps along his branch in a sort of aerial jump. Finally, the cascade is lowered and the bird is quiet again.
