## DEMOCRATIC BLOC AIDS REPUBLICANS CONFIRM DANAHER

### No Opposition To Two Other Gubernatorial Nominations; Three Judges Given Reappointments.

State Capitol, Hartford, Jan. 25.—(AP)—The Senate confirmed the appointment of Cornelius J. Danaher, Meriden Republican, as state labor commissioner, over-riding the protests of several Democratic senators. The vote was 22 to 12.

Although their floor leader, Senator Joseph B. Downes of Norwich, led the opposition to Danaher's confirmation, four members of the Democratic Senate bloc of 17 voted with Republicans and Socialists to place the veteran labor counsel in charge of the Labor Department for a four-year term.

He will succeed Joseph M. Tene, Democrat, on July 1.

After Danaher had formally been appointed to the \$9,000 a year post, the Senate confirmed without opposition two other gubernatorial nominations, Walter E. Perry, New Haven Democrat, as bank commissioner, and George C. Walsh of Fairfield to fill a vacancy on the State Park and Forest Commission.

The Democrats who voted for Danaher's confirmation were Senators William of New Haven, Led with Meriden, Culture of Waterbury and Sanford of Cromwell.

### 2,000 REPORTED DEAD IN QUAKE SHAKING CHILE

Normal Communications Interrupted By Midnight  
Tremor Affecting 400-  
Mile Strip Of Coastline.

Santiago, Chile, Jan. 25.—(AP)—An Army plane surveying the scene of a disastrous Chilean earthquake today flew low over Chillan, 250 miles south of Santiago, and reported sending the city of 40,000 people into a "complete state of confusion."

The report of heavy damage was made as three Army planes flew south to check on confirmed reports of 2,000 persons who were killed in the Concepcion area by a 400-mile strip of Chile's coast and shattered normal communications.

Aboard the U. S. Cruiser Omaha, near Barcelona, Jan. 25.—(AP)—Fifteen Americans, fleeing the beleaguered Barcelona area, had to run a gauntlet of bombs today before they reached safety aboard the Omaha and the United States destroyer Bagley.

One bomb fell 100 feet from the refugees as they stood on a breakwater waiting for a small boat to take them out to the ships, anchored about two miles off Catalonia, approximately 30 miles north of Barcelona.

The Federation's proposed revision of the Wagner act was outlined in a series of 16 amendments, approved by President William Green of the AFL, and introduced in the Senate by Senator Walsh (D., Mass.).

In general, the amendment would curtail the Board's power to invalidate union contracts and would seek to provide more specific protection for craft unions in the establishment of collective bargaining units.

Chief of Police Charles A. Anderson said that under questioning Cota admitted taking part in the crime. Cota, the chief said, told him that Weaver was driving the car on the night of the holdup. The car was parked near the drug market and Weaver left him sitting in it, Cota said. A little later Weaver came back and said he had shot a man, according to Cota's story, and then the two went home.

On the strength of Cota's story Weaver was arrested yesterday and confronted with his friend's statement and then admitted to participation in the crime.
