State Capitol, Hartford, Jan. 25 -(AP) - The Senate confirmed the appointment of Cornelius J. Dana-her, Meriden Republican, as state shoulder. Robert Long, a former labor commissioner, over-riding the protests of several Democratic senators. The vote was 22 to 12. Although their floor leader, Sen-ator Joseph B. Downes of Norwich, led the opposition to Danaher's con-firmation, four members of the Democratic Senate bloc of 17 voted Democratic Senate bloc of 17 voted with Republicans and Socialists to place the veteran labor counsel in charge of the Labor Department for a four year term.

He will succeed Joseph M. Tone, Democrat, on July 1.
