

The final paragraph of the article reads as follows: "Since the article reads as follows: "Since the department itself appears to completely lack the initiative to put itself in line with every other modern state police department, it becomes the necessary job of either the Governor or the General Assembly to stimulate it into action."

May I respectfully inform you that ever since my appointment to this department, I have advocated the use of radio and sufficient funds have been set up in each and every budget, submitted to the General Assembly, requesting approval for the installation of radio. Each time this item has been removed from our budget, but, in spite of this fact, I have appeared before the Appropriations Committee in the 1933, 1935 and 1937 sessions to make an urgent plea that they reconsider and grant us sufficient funds to allow for radio. The foregoing statements are supported by newspaper publicity, given at the time, and also documents of public record.
