Washington, Feb. 2. — (AP) — President Roosevelt stamped as a "deliberate lie" today a statement that he called the Rhine River, between France and Germany, an American frontier.

Speaking in tense, grave tones at his press conference, the chief executive declared the statement was a deliberate lie and a gross misrepresentation of the administration's policy.

He said he had had the statement in question put to him by a reporter who asked if he had said what was reported. "I would not want to be known as lying," he said.

The old harbor station's surfboat took off the others aboard her: Captain Randall, C. H. Moore, James Gibbons, Arthur Amerson, Frederick Cuddeback, all of St. John's, and Carey, Cape Croix, N.Y., and Chayton, Fort Union, N.Y.

Coast Guard officers said all were about 30 years old and suffered no ill effects.

They added the Lutzan appeared to have suffered no serious damage. The Coast Guard cutter Taboo and the patrol boat Faunce were ordered to the scene from Provincetown and Plymouth to attempt to boat her.

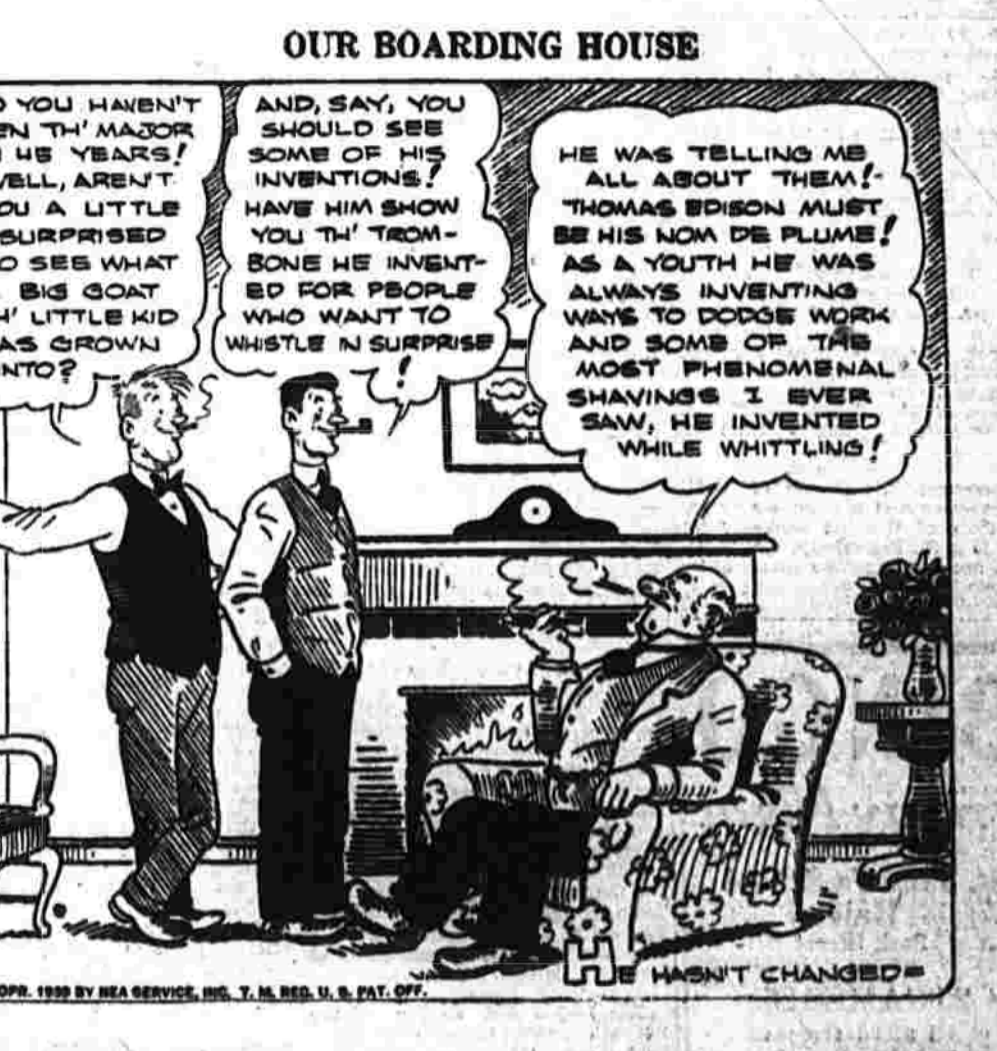
