PART OF WPA IN OHIO FLOOD IS UNDER FIRE

Health Authorities Immunize Thousands Of Kentucky Mountain People Against Disease Feared In Wake.

Louisville, Ky., Feb. 6.—(AP)—Health authorities today immunized thousands of Eastern Kentucky mountaineers against pneumonia, influenza and typhoid—more feared than the overflowing streams which swept the hill country and flooded lowlands.

As rehabilitation program directed by the state health department moved toward the mountain people, the Federal Communications Commission refused to recommend further funds until the program was approved by President Roosevelt which was accomplished.
