





In other countries Horace is remembered as a famous Latin poet who was exceedingly witty. But not so today in black shirt Italy. Horace is retailed as the poet who left the republicanism of Brutus to devote himself wholeheartedly to the imperial ideal of Augustus. Augustus, to the Fasciats, was the Mussolini of ancient times.

Commemorating the 200th anniversary of the birth of Horace, a 1936 Italian stamp is shown above portraying a dying warrier from a scene in one of the poet's great



He was too absorbed in the business of writing and he loved life too well on his quiet Sabine farm which had been given him because of his literar Horace, or Quintus Horatius

Piaccus as he was known in Rome, was born in humble sur-roundings but his father gave him the best education available at the time. He studied in Athens, travtime. He studied in Athens, trav-eled. He was the model of sobriety, honesty, self-control, due very largely to his father's rigorous training.


