

An authorisation for a \$500,000 expenditure during the next four years, \$550,000 by the Bureau of Mines and \$150,000 by the Geological-Survey, also was included to finance the development of raw materials in this country.

Although the measure was not included in the administration's rearmament program, Thomas said it was allied closely with it.

"World conditions make this bill very, very timely," Thomas said. Similar measures are pending in the House.

CITY of pre-Roman origins is picturesque Carcassonne, located in southwestern France and capital of the department of Aude The river Aude divides it into two parts, one strictly modern, the Vills Basse, and the other eminently ancient, Cita.

It is in the older city that remains of the early civilizations may still be seen, the chief of which is the striking fortress, Carcassonne, rising on an isolated hillock on the right bank of the river. Probably no fortress in the world has changed hands more often, certainly none has seen more history sweep through its massive gates.

On the disintegration of the Roman empire, it fell into the hands of the Visigoths. But they in turn were expelled by the Arabs and the Arabs surrendered to Pippin the Short. For a time the town and fortress was a separate countship, but it was taken in 1200 by the Crusaders. Revolt followed, however, and in 1262 the insurgents were expelled by royal authority. They moved across the river and founded the new Carcassonne. In 1356 the citadel successfully resisted the Black Prince, but it changed hands often during the religious wars. The fortification lost its significance finally when the area was annexed to France in 1659.
