EFFORTS TO QUIET INDUSTRIAL FEARS IS GIVEN IMPETUS

Barkeley Asserts He Has Received Word No General Anti-Monopoly Legislation Will Be Offered.

Washington, Feb. 23.—(AP)—The Roosevelt administration's efforts to quiet business fears and encourage private investment gained impetus today as a statement by Democratic Leader Barkeley of the Senate that he had received word no general anti-monopoly legislation would be offered at this session of Congress.

Barkeley told reporters he had received the information from Senator O'Mahoney (D., Wyo.), of the special committee of legislators and government officials appointed to investigate monopoly and other economic problems.

The Senate leader added, however, that the committee would not add legislation until it had completed its investigations.

Barkeley's statement was one of several apparent indications that the cry of business against the present session of Congress would be comparatively small.
